

Section 5: Programs Linked to High School

A. Advanced Placement Program

Advanced Placement (AP) is a program of college level courses and examinations for high school students. AP is administered by the College Entrance Examination Board, headquartered in New York City, New York with a Canadian office in Kelowna, British Columbia. Students who successfully complete examinations with a prescribed standing may, upon admission to a public postsecondary institution, be granted credit as outlined in the following table. **Please consult the appropriate institutional calendar or Registrar's/Student Services Office for more information.**
