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Question and Answers Self-Study Program

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What is the Self-Study Program (SSP)

- The SSP will assist Apprentices/Trade Qualifiers to develop their own personal study plan, explore, and review resources such as examination study guides and sample quizzes.
- □ The SSP was designed by focusing on study habits, techniques, how-to, do's, don'ts, tips, mnemonic devices, memorization skills, and mastering multiple choice with the Block, Provincial and Red Seal exams.
- **The program provides a counselling session with the Apprentice/Trade Qualifier.**
- □ The **minimum** duration to remain in this program is <u>30</u> days. If you need additional time to prepare, the **maximum** duration allows for up to 90 days.
- The benefits will:
 - Gain your attention
 - Inform you of learning objectives/sub-tasks
 - Stimulate recall of prior learning
 - Provide guidance and encouragement
 - Elicit performance
 - Provide feedback from exam results breakdown to identify strengths/weaknesses
 - Provide organization and structure for study purposes
 - Assess performance during and at the end of the plan

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Do I qualify for the SSP?

To be eligible, for the program, you must meet the following **three** criteria:

- 1) Your Apprenticeship Program Officer (APO) refers you to the program.
- 2) Your most recent exam must be written within the last 10 years.
- 3) During the last two years, you have remained active in your trade.

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What steps are involved concerning participation with the SSP?

- 1) If you meet the criteria described in #2, the APO will recommend that you partake in the SSP as the first option.
- 2) Download the SSP Registration Form. Your APO will provide the link or attach the document in the referral email.
- **3)** Fill out the form and select the date/time you are able to participate in a group counselling session. Submit to email address on the form. You must submit by the deadline date provided for the month chosen.
- 4) Once scheduled for the counselling session and registered for the SSP, a confirmation email with the next steps will be sent to you within five days of receiving your registration form.
- 5) A Student Kit package will be forwarded to you through a follow-up email. The documentation included will assist you in taking a positive approach to preparing for your rewrite examination. Review the material before the session takes place.

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What is a Group Counselling Session?

- □ Includes participation from Apprentices and/or Trade Qualifiers across the province, via teleconference, for approximately **60** minutes.
- □ The **three steps** involved in completing the SSP are discussed, in detail, at the beginning of the session.
- **D** Provides guidance and assistance to help prepare for the rewrite exam.
- Reviews the documents sent previously by email. The session discusses how each one can be used to benefit your study routine and preparation.
- Includes discussion about the Multiple Choice exam format using three types of questions to test your
 - Knowledge and recall abilities (**Type 1**)
 - Procedural and Mathematical skills (**Type 2**)
 - Abilities to think outside the box in order to solve a situation making use of critical thinking skills (Type 3)

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What is a Group Counselling Session? (Continued)

- **Explains several measures that can be used to gain marks and avoid losing marks.**
- **D** Suggests structural methods to study effectively by using organizational strategies.
- **D** Points you to the activities/objectives that are used to help with development of the exam.
- □ Suggests **three** study methods to help assist with the process of studying and preparing for the **Type 1, 2 and 3** questions you will potentially get on the exam.
- Discusses other items of information that will help with preparation of an exam re-write.
- **Time** is given for questions and answers at the end of the session.
- You are considered **active** in the program once registered and participation in the counselling session has taken place.
- Sessions occur the **last** Thursday and Friday of every month.
- **•** You must participate in **only one** session.
- □ ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY. If you are unable to make the session, email selfstudyplan@gov.nl.ca to discuss.

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What are the three steps in completing the SSP?

- 1) Participate in a counselling session.
- 2) Remain in the program for <u>minimum</u> of **30** days and no longer than **90** days <u>maximum</u>.
- 3) When you feel ready and well prepared to register for the rewrite exam, return the Completion/Agreement by email, to selfstudyplan@gov.nl.ca

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What happens if I am unable to meet the maximum deadline of 90 days?

If the reason for an extension request is warranted, contact the Program Development Specialist (PDS) at **selfstudyplan@gov.nl.cat**o discuss an alternate timeline.

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What happens when I complete the SSP?

- Once you have submitted the Completion/Agreement through email to selfstudyplan@gov.nl.ca., the PDS will reply with confirmation of program completion and approval to register for the re-write, with a copy emailed to the Exam Coordinator and APO. Note that the approval verifies you have completed the SSP and now meet the criteria to register for the exam.
- The link to access and download the rewrite registration form is included in the approval email. You must complete and submit this registration form to register for your rewrite.
- □ The information regarding fees is included in the body of the email for Red Seal rewrite candidates.
- □ For a LevelExam, the registration form must be sent to blockexams@gov.nl.ca. For a Red Seal Exam, the registration form must be sent to certificationexams@gov.nl.ca.
