Things to remember:

- Continue to follow the public health measures, wearing a mask, staying at least 2 metres from others and limiting social contacts.
- Bring your immunization record with you for the second dose and report any side effects you experienced after the first dose.
- Keep this sheet or retrieve your official immunization record at Home COVID-19 (gov.nl.ca)
- Do not receive testing for tuberculosis (TB) until at least 28 days after a COVID-19 vaccine (unless recommended by your health care provider).
- If possible, wait at least two weeks after vaccination or completing your vaccination series before starting drugs that suppress your immune system, as recommended by your healthcare provider.
- For children under 12 years of age: wait 14 days after a dose of COVID-19 vaccine before receiving any other vaccines
- Based on NACI recommendations, COVID-19 booster doses may be available for certain populations. Please review at https://www.gov.nl.ca/covid-19/vaccine/gettheshot/ to see if you are eligible.
- You can also download the CANImmunize app at https://www.canimmunize.ca/en/home to keep track of this and other vaccine.

It is important to receive any COVID-19 vaccine dose that you are eligible for. To achieve optimal protection from COVID-19, you should also receive a booster dose when you are eligible. If you are between 5 and 29 years of age, your second dose should be booked at least eight weeks after your first dose. If you are 30 years of age and older, your second dose should be booked at least 28 days and up to four months after the first dose. If you are eligible for a first booster dose, you must wait at least 22 weeks after completing your primary series. If you are eligible for a second booster dose you must wait at least 20 weeks after receiving your first booster dose.
