• The Chair welcomed the guest from Municipalities Newfoundland and Labrador (MNL) to the meeting.

2. Presentation by MNL

- The presentation by Dr. Walsh provided an overview of the work that MNL is involved in, as well as overview of their strategic priorities.
- According to Dr. Walsh, evidence suggests that a federally-funded basic income is not only feasible in Canada, but could bring significant benefits at the municipal level by alleviating pressures on municipalities to address poverty.
- MNL has been advocating for a basic income. Both MNL and the City of St. John's'
 passed resolutions to engage with the Federal and Provincial governments regarding
 the establishment of basic income.

• The attendees discussed the issues municipalities face related to the provision of services, such as housing and public transportation, as well as the inter-connectivity with and benefits that could be seen from basic income.
