## Life License Qualification Program Update Financial Services Regulation Division

The Office of the Superintendent of Insurance is pleased to announce that the Life License Qualification Program (LLQP) in classroom examinations will resume immediately with the assistance of the College of the North Atlantic.

To be eligible to write the LLQP Modular Exams, registrants will have to contact one of the designated College of the North Atlantic Campuses to register. To be eligible to write the modular LLQP exams, candidates are required to have a valid Canadian Insurance Participant Registry (CIPR) number along with a copy of a government issued photo ID. It is important for candidates to use their legal name that matches their valid government issued photo ID. If the CIPR ID does not match the valid government issued photo ID, a candidate may not be eligible to write the modular exams.

In order to have a valid CIPR number, a candidate must have successfully completed a qualifying LLQP training course from a provincially approved course provider. A candidate who fails to meet all conditions will not be eligible to write the exams. Once it is determined that a candidate is eligible to write, our office will send an email confirming registration and the details regarding the examination process. The cost per module is \$35.

The candidate will receive their results via email within 10 business days of writing their exam. The passing mark per module is 60%. Once a candidate has successfully completed all modules, our office will send a confirmation letter to the mailing address provided on the most recent exam.
