COVID-19 Update Life License Qualification Program Update Financial Services Regulation Division

The Office of the Superintendent of Insurance is pleased to announce the partnership with Durham College to offer the Life License Qualification Program (LLQP) online examinations for residents of Newfoundland and Labrador.

To be eligible to write the modular LLQP exams, candidates are required to have a valid Canadian Insurance Participant Registry (CIPR) number along with a copy of a government issued photo ID. It is important for candidates to use their legal name that matches their valid government issued photo ID. If the CIPR ID does not match the valid government issued photo ID, a candidate may not be eligible to write the modular exams.

In order to have a valid CIPR number, a candidate must have successfully completed a qualifying LLQP training course from a provincially approved course provider. A candidate who fails to meet all conditions will not be eligible to write the modular exams.

To be eligible to write the modular exams online through Durham College, registrants will have to do the following:

- Email the Office of the Superintendent of Insurance (<u>LLQPadmin@gov.nl.ca</u>) and indicate their Canadian Insurance Participant Registry (CIPR) number along with a copy of a government issued photo ID.
- Candidates must use their legal name that matches their valid government issued photo ID.
- Once our office has determined that the registrant is eligible to write the exam, our office will forward on the registrant's name to Durham College.
- Durham College will contact the registrant directly to register for the exam when new dates and times slots are available.
- The cost of each module is \$66, paid directly to Durham College when registering for the exam.
- Exam results are verified by Durham College before being released. The candidate will receive their results via email within 10 business days of writing their exam. The passing mark per module is 60%.
