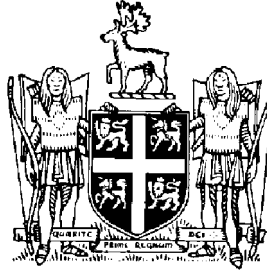

1. Section 20 of the *Children, Youth and Families Regulations* is amended by adding immediately after subsection (2) the following:

(3) Notwithstanding paragraph (1)(f), a registered social worker who was employed by a family-based placement provider licensee at the time of the coming into force of these regulations, is not required to provide proof that he or she has worked a minimum of 5 years as a registered social worker.

2. (1) Subsection 23(5) is repealed and the following substituted:

(5) A licensee shall ensure that all staff and caregivers at a facility operated by the licensee obtain the certifications referred to in subsection (4) within 6 months of the date the licensee was issued a licence.

(2) Section 23 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (8) the following:

(8.1) Notwithstanding subsection (4) and paragraph (6)(b), a provincial director may exempt a caregiver or a caregiver applicant from the requirement to obtain or renew one or more of the certifications referred to in subsection (4) where

- (a) the licensee submits a written request to a provincial director; and
- (b) the provincial director is satisfied that exceptional circumstances exist which justify granting the exemption.

(9) An exemption granted under subsection (8.1) may be subject to the terms and conditions that a provincial director may impose.

Short title **1.** This Notice may be cited as the *Department of Advanced Education, Skills and Labour Notice*.

Definitions **2.** In this Notice

- (a) "department" means the Department of Advanced Education, Skills and Labour; and

- (b) "minister" means the Minister of Advanced Education, Skills and Labour.

Departmental
structure

3. (1) The department was confirmed by Order in Council 2017-025.

(2) The department is presided over by the minister.

(3) The department has 4 branches, as follows:

- (a) Corporate Services and Policy;
- (b) Post-Secondary Education;
- (c) Regional Service Delivery; and
- (d) Workforce Development, Labour and Immigration.

Powers and duties
of the minister

4. The powers, functions and duties of the minister include the supervision, control and direction of all matters relating to

- (a) assessment and alleviation of cases of economic hardship by the provision of appropriate publicly funded financial assistance, and the administration of programs designed to ensure the integrity of that publicly funded financial assistance;
- (b) provision of employment and career programs and services, in co-operation with other departments of the government of the province and, as appropriate, the Government of Canada, the government of other provinces and with other entities, to enhance employability and assist individuals to compete for, attain and retain employment;
- (c) programs to provide for the prevention, compliance and enforcement concerning matters referred to in paragraph (a);
- (d) recommending and advising upon training courses for the work force and those entering it;
- (e) monitoring and ensuring the progress of post-secondary education and training institutions;

- (f) programs to support adult literacy;
- (g) College of the North Atlantic;
- (h) Memorial University of Newfoundland;
- (i) private training institutions registered under the *Private Training Institutions Act*;
- (j) financial assistance for students attending post-secondary educational institutions;
- (k) collection of student loans;
- (l) training, certification and qualifications of apprentices, trade qualifiers and journeypersons;
- (m) international educational services;
- (n) skills development under the Labour Market Development Agreement;
- (o) immigration and multiculturalism;
- (p) financial services, corporate policy, planning, service improvement and information management for the department; and

Short title **1.** This Notice may be cited as the *Department of Transportation and Works Notice*.

Definitions **2.** In this Notice

- (a) "department" means, unless the context indicates otherwise, the Department of Transportation and Works; and
- (b) "minister" means, unless the context indicates otherwise, the Minister of Transportation and Works.

Departmental
structure

3. (1) The department was restructured by Order in Council 2017-037.

- (2) The department is presided over by the minister.
- (3) The department has 4 branches, as follows:
 - (a) Air and Marine Services;
 - (b) Infrastructure;
 - (c) Operations; and
 - (d) Strategic and Corporate Services.

Powers and duties
of the minister

4. The powers, functions and duties of the minister include the supervision, control and direction of all matters relating to

- (a) design, construction, improvement, repair and maintenance of highways, local roads, airstrips, ferry landings, railways and related facilities and the acquisition of property related to highways, local roads, airstrips, ferries and related facilities;
- (b) the acquisition, use, maintenance and operation of ferries under ownership, charter or administration;
- (c) the acquisition, use, maintenance and operation of provincial air ambulance, waterbomber and other aircraft and services under ownership, charter or administration;
- (d) property that belongs to or is held or occupied by the Crown, and the works and properties acquired, constructed, extended, enlarged, repaired or improved at the expense of the province, or for the acquisition, construction, extension, enlargement, repair or improvement of which public funds are voted and appropriated by the Legislature, other than

- property and works assigned under another Act to another minister or department of the government of the province;
- (e) property management generally including the design, construction, repair, maintenance, heating, lighting, cleaning and security of buildings that belong to or are held or occupied by the Crown and grounds that belong to those buildings;
 - (f) the leasing of real property by the Crown and related activities; and
 - (g) the disposition of surplus provincial assets and real property;
 - (h) subject to the *Public Procurement Act*,
 - (i) a role in the procurement, distribution, control, furnishing of supplies, including the providing, purchasing, advice or other assistance to government departments or public institutions or otherwise acquiring of goods, services and supplies required in the public service of the province, including public institutions, to attain the best value for government, and
 - (ii) the establishment, maintenance and operation of depots or warehouses in which supplies may be stored and from which they may be distributed; and
 - (i) highway signage,

which are not, or in so far as they are not, the responsibility of another minister, agency, body, corporation, board, organization or person.

Administration of
Acts

5. (1) The minister has sole responsibility for the administration of the Acts set out in Schedule A and of all orders and regulations passed or made under those Acts, including those powers, functions or duties necessary or desirable for carrying out the purposes of those Acts.

(2) The minister and the minister of the departments indicated in Schedules B and C share responsibility for the administration of the Acts set out in Schedules B and C and of the orders and regulations passed or made under those Acts, including those powers, functions or

duties necessary or desirable for carrying out the purposes of those Acts.

(3) The minister has primary responsibility for the administration of the Acts set out in Schedule B and secondary responsibility for the administration of the Acts set out in Schedule C.

6. The *Department of Works, Services and Transportation Notice, 2003, Newfoundland and Labrador Regulation 91/03, is repealed.*
