PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY DECLARATION

CONCERNING a declaration of a public health emergency pursuant to section 27 of the *Public Health Protection and Promotion Act*, SNL 2018, c P-37.3

WHEREAS the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic on March 11, 2020; and

WHEREAS pursuant to section 27 of the *Public Health Protection and Promotion Act*, SNL 2018, c P-37.3 (the "Act"), the Minister of Health and Community Services, on the advice of the Chief Medical Officer of Health, may declare a public health emergency where the Minister is satisfied that a public health emergency exists and that the public health emergency cannot be sufficiently mitigated or remedied without the implementation of the special measures available under section 28 of the Act; and

WHEREAS this pandemic constitutes an imminent threat of the communicable disease, COVID-19, that presents a serious risk to the health of the population which requires the immediate implementation of certain measures under section 28 of the Act; and

WHEREAS pursuant to subsection 27(2) of the Act, a declaration of a public health emergency expires no more than 14 days after it is made, which may be extended for consecutive periods of 14 days pursuant to subsection 27(3) of the Act where, on the advice of the Chief Medical Officer of Health, the public health emergency continues to exist and the extension is required to protect the health of the population; and

WHEREAS pursuant to subsection 27(4) of the Act, a declaration of a public health emergency or an extension of a public health emergency shall identify the nature of the public health emergency, describe the area of the province to which it relates, and specify the dates when the declaration takes effect and when it expires; and

WHEREAS pursuant to section 28 of the Act, the Chief Medical Officer of Health is authorized to exercise any of the special measures outlined therein while a declaration of a public health emergency is in effect; and

WHEREAS pursuant to subsection 27(6) of the Act, the Chief Medical Officer of Health shall publish the details of this declaration without delay and in a manner that can reasonably be expected to notify the residents of the province to whom the declaration relates;

NOW THEREFORE I, Dr. John Haggie, Minister of Health and Community Services, on the advice of Dr. Janice Fitzgerald, Chief Medical Officer of Health, hereby make the following declaration:

PURSUANT to section 27 of the Act, a PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY:

is declared as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic;

is in effect for the entire province of Newfoundland and Labrador; and

is declared for a period of 14 days effective immediately.

TAKE NOTICE that the TOWN OF CONCEPTION BAY SOUTH Development Regulations Amendment No. 33, 2020, adopted by the Town Council on February 4th, 2020, has been registered by the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Environment.

In general terms, CONCEPTION BAY SOUTH Development Regulations Amendment No. 33, 2020 adds "Residential Complexes" as a definition to the Development Regulations along with standards for those complexes without increased potential housing densities in each land

use zone. Residential complexes include properties with multiple buildings and or multiple residential units on the same property that are retained by one owner or multiple owners through a condominium corporation.

CONCEPTION BAY SOUTH Development Regulations Amendment No. 33, 2020 comes into effect on the day that a notice is published in the *Newfoundland and Labrador Gazette*. In general terms, CONCEPTION BAY SOUTH Development Regulations Amendment No. 34, 2020 adds "Specific Use Regulations" for family and home-based child care uses where there are seven or less children cared for in the home. The amendment provides specific regulations designed to mitigate impacts on residential neighborhoods and identifies the amount of floor space within a dwelling that can be used for the business.

Short title

1. This Order may be cited as the Livestock Owners Compensation Order, 2020.

Definitions

2. In this Order

(a) "calves" means dairy cattle and beef cattle, male or female, under one year old; and

(b) "heifers" includes female dairy cattle and female beef cattle and means an animal which is more than one year old and has not given birth to a calf.

Compensation

- **3.** The amount of compensation to be paid to owners insured under the Livestock Insurance Plan for losses caused to livestock by dogs or predators during the period April 1, 2020 to March 31, 2021 is as follows:
 - (a) dairy cattle per head
 - (i) for registered bulls, \$750
 - (ii) for unregistered bulls, 500
 - (iii) for registered cows, 750
 - (iv) for unregistered cows, 500
 - (v) for registered heifers, 500
 - (vi) for unregistered heifers, 300
 - (vii) for registered calves, 150
 - (viii) for unregistered calves, 70
 - (b) beef cattle per head
 - (i) for registered bulls, \$650
 - (ii) for unregistered bulls, 400
 - (iii) for registered cows, 650
 - (iv) for unregistered cows, 400
 - (v) for registered heifers, 400
 - (vi) for unregistered heifers, 200
 - (vii) for registered calves, 100
 - (viii) for unregistered calves, 70

- (c) sheep per head
 - (i) for registered rams over one year, \$450
 - (ii) for unregistered rams over one year, 210
 - (iii) for registered ewes over one year, 400
 - (iv) for unregistered ewes over one year, 210
 - (v) for registered ram lambs under one year, 600
 - (vi) for unregistered ram lambs under one year, 125
 - (vii) for registered ewe lambs under one year, 530
 - (viii) for unregistered ewe lambs under one year, 125
- (d) goats per head
 - (i) for registered bucks over one year, \$250
 - (ii) for unregistered bucks over one year, 200
 - (iii) for registered does over one year, 250
 - (iv) for unregistered does over one year, 200
 - (v) for registered bucks under one year, 200
 - (vi) for unregistered bucks under one year, 100
 - (vii) for registered does under one year, 200
 - (viii) for unregistered does under one year, 100

Repeal 4. The *Livestock Owners Compensation Order*, 2019, Newfoundland and Labrador regulation 13/19, is repealed.

Commencement 5. This Order comes into force April 1, 2020.
