s.26 Where child has been removed	Application for a protective intervention hearing has to be filed within 24 hours of removal	Application for a protective intervention hearing has to be filed within 5 days of removal
s.34 (1)(b) Adjournment	A judge may adjourn a proceeding under the Act one or more times, for a total period of up to 3 months to allow for an assessment to be completed	A judge may adjourn a proceeding one or more times, for a total period of up to 6 months to allow for an assessment to be completed
s.36(2) Subsequent order	The manager's or social worker's plan for the child shall be filed with the application for a subsequent order under subsection (1)	The manager's or social worker's plan for the child shall be filed no later than 10 days before the hearing

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that in accordance with the authority under section 3 of the *Temporary Variation of Statutory Deadlines Act*, the Minister of Natural Resources, on the advice of the Attorney General, hereby varies the following deadline:

Under the *Mineral Act*, RSNL1990 c. M-12:  
Section 39(2) The requirement to submit a notice of grievance within 30 days of the decision of the recorder, or within 30 days of the occurrence of the event is varied to 90 days.

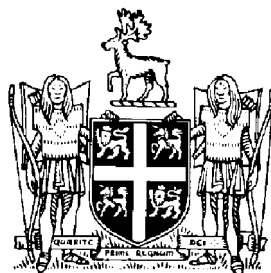
Under the Mineral Regulations, CNLR 1143/96:  
Section 52(b) The requirement to remedy deficiencies or apply for an extension under Condition 2 of Schedule A or B to the Mineral Act within 30 days is varied to 90 days.

*Shops' Closing Regulations (Amendment)*  
under the  
*Shops' Closing Act*  
(O.C. 2020-061)

*(Filed April 6, 2020)*

Under the authority of section 10 of the *Shops' Closing Act*, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council makes the following regulations.

CNLR 1115/96

**1. (1) Section 2 of the *Shops' Closing Regulations* is amended by renumbering it as subsection 2(1), deleting the word "and" at the end of paragraph (m), deleting the period at the end of paragraph (n) and substituting a semi-colon and the word "and" and by adding immediately after paragraph (n) the following:**

- (o) retail shops that provide services essential to the life, health or personal safety of individuals and animals including

- (i) food,
- (ii) pharmaceutical products, medicine and medical devices,
- (iii) personal hygiene products,
- (iv) cleaning products,
- (v) baby and child products,
- (vi) gas stations,
- (vii) computer and cellphone service and repair,
- (viii) electronic and office supplies,
- (ix) hardware supplies, and
- (x) pet and animal supplies.

**(2) Section 2 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (1) the following:**

- (2) Paragraph (1)(o) shall be repealed on April 11, 2020.
