1. Subsections 37(1) and (2) of the *Children*, *Youth and Families Regulations* are repealed and the following substituted:

Indigenous representatives

- **37.** (1) An Indigenous government or organization may designate one or more Indigenous representatives.
- (2) Where an Indigenous government or organization designates one or more Indigenous representatives it shall notify the minister, in writing, of the name of each Indigenous representative.

Commencement

2. These regulations come into force on June 30, 2021.

1. Section 6 of the *Child and Parental Benefits Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:

Nutritional supplement benefit

6. An eligible individual who receives on behalf of a qualified dependent the NLCB calculated in accordance with these regulations is entitled to receive, for the 11 month period effective the first of the month following the month during which birth occurred, a supplementary benefit of \$100 a month.

Commencement

2. These regulations come into force on July 1, 2021.

1. Section 3 of the *Labrador Border Zones Rebate Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:

Rebate amount

- **3.** The rebate of tax established under section 98.1 of the Act shall be calculated as follows:
 - (a) for cigarettes, \$0.1875 per cigarette; and
 - (b) for tobacco, \$0.3936 per gram.

2. Commencement

NLR 73/11 as amended

1. Section 16.2 of the *Revenue Administration Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:

Industrial facility exemption

16.2 A carbon product used in a source category prescribed in paragraphs 5(1)(a), (c), (d) and (e) of the *Management of Greenhouse Gas Reporting Regulations* by an industrial facility that has a greenhouse gas reduction target under section 5 of the *Management of*

Greenhouse Gas Act in the year in which the carbon product was purchased is exempt from the tax imposed under subsection 72.1(1) of the Act.

Commencement

2. These regulations are considered to have come into force on January 1, 2019.
