TAKE NOTICE that the TOWN OF NORTHERN ARM MUNICIPAL PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 1, 2021, AND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS AMENDMENT NO. 1, 2021, as adopted by Council on the 13th day of April, 2021, has been registered by the Minister of Municipal and Provincial Affairs.

IN GENERAL TERMS, MUNICIPAL PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 1, 2021, will re-designate an area of land of land from Residential to Mixed Use and Tourism Commercial to Mixed Use. DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS AMENDMENT NO. 1, 2021, rezone the same area of land from Residential Medium Density (RMD) to Mixed Development (MD) and Commercial Tourist (CT) to Mixed Development (MD). The Amendment will change the Accessory Building Condition in the Residential Medium Density (RMD), Residential Rural (RR), Residential Seasonal (RS) and the Mixed Development (MD) Land Use Zone Tables, Schedule C.

NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR REGULATION 34/21

Film and Video Industry Tax Credit Regulations (Amendment) under the Income Tax Act, 2000 (O.C. 2021-176)

(Filed June 30, 2021)

1. S.7 Amdt. Tax credit 2. Commencement

NLR 3/99 as amended

1. Subsection 7(4) of the *Film and Video Industry Tax Credit Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:

(4) The maximum tax credit within a 12 month period that may be received by an eligible corporation, together with all corporations associated with that corporation, in respect of all eligible projects commenced on or after July 1, 2021 is \$5,000,000.

Commencement

2. These regulations come into force on July 1, 2021.

5. S.6 Amdt. Disciplinary action

1. (1) Paragraph 3(1)(a) of the *Diagnostic and Therapeutic Drug Regulations*, 2012 is repealed and the following substituted:

(a) graduated on or after January 1, 1995 from an educational body approved by the council, and has successfully completed the pharmaceutical section of the Optometric Assessment Examinations administered by the Canadian Examiners in Optometry; or

(2) Subsection 3(3) of the regulations is amended by deleting the word "and" at the end of paragraph (e), by deleting the period at the end of paragraph (f) and substituting a semi-colon and by adding immediately after paragraph (f) the following:

(g) topical ocular corticosteroids; and

(h) topical ocular anti-infective corticosteroid combinations.

(3) Subsection 3(4) of the regulations is repealed.

2. The regulations are amended by adding immediately after section 3 the following:

3.1 (1) The council may issue an advanced diagnostic and therapeutic drug certificate to an optometrist who

- (a) graduated on or after January 1, 2015 from an educational body approved by the council and has successfully completed the entry to practice examinations approved by the council; or
- (b) graduated prior to January 1, 2015 from an educational body approved by the council and has successfully completed an advanced scope certificate course approved by the council.

(2) An optometrist who holds an advanced diagnostic and therapeutic drug certificate may

(a) diagnose, treat and manage glaucoma in accordance with standards set by the council; and

(b) administer and prescribe pharmaceutical agents listed in Schedules I and II of the Newfoundland and Labrador Drug Schedules, as adopted by the Newfoundland and Labrador Pharmacy Board under the *Pharmacy Regulations, 2014*, to treat and manage ocular disease, except for narcotics and other controlled pharmaceutical agents.

3. Section 4 of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

Foreign bodies

4. An optometrist may remove superficial foreign bodies from the human eye and surrounding tissue by performing surgical procedures on body tissue

- (a) below the dermis or mucous membrane; or
- (b) in or below the surface of the cornea.

4. Section 5 of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

Suspension or revocation

5. The council may suspend or revoke a diagnostic drug certificate, a therapeutic drug certificate or an advanced diagnostic and therapeutic drug certificate where the member fails to maintain standards set by the council.

5. (1) Subsection 6(1) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

Disciplinary action

6. (1) Where an optometrist

- (a) prescribes or administers pharmaceutical agents without the appropriate certificate;
- (b) prescribes or administers pharmaceutical agents not authorized by the certificate he or she holds; or
- (c) diagnoses, treats or manages glaucoma without the appropriate certificate,

that action shall be considered conduct deserving of sanction for the purposes of Part IV of the *Optometry Act, 2012*.

(2) Subsection 6(2) of the regulations is repealed.
