GREETING;

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS in and by section 53 of An Act Respecting the Office of the Auditor General and the Auditing of the Public Accounts of the Province, Statutes of Newfoundland and Labrador 2021, Chapter A-22.1 (the "Act") it is provided that the Act comes into force on a day to be proclaimed by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the Act shall now come into force;

NOW KNOW YE, THAT WE, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council of Our Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, do by this our Proclamation declare and direct that An Act Respecting the

Office of the Auditor General and the Auditing of the Public Accounts of the Province, Statutes of Newfoundland and Labrador 2021, Chapter A-22.1, shall come into force on the date of publication of this Proclamation in the *Newfoundland and Labrador Gazette*.

OF ALL WHICH OUR LOVING SUBJECTS AND ALL OTHERS whom these Presents may concern are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.
