NOTICE OF REGISTRATION TOWN OF FOGO ISLAND AMENDMENT NO. 3-2022 DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS 2015-2025

TAKE NOTICE that AMENDMENT NO. 3, 2022, TO THE TOWN OF FOGO ISLAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS 2015-2025, adopted on the 6th day of October, 2022, has been registered by the Minister of Municipal and Provincial Affairs.

The said Development Regulations includes Regulation 38(2) which says:

(2) Unless specifically provided in Schedule C, accessory buildings shall be located in the rear yard or side yard on the lot, except where topography or natural or built features on the lot or the street(s) providing access to the lot make it practically impossible to locate an accessory building in a side or rear yard. In such cases, a discretionary use may be approved which would allow accessory buildings to be built in those portions of the existing front yard which are adjacent to each side lot line, each said portion lying between the side lot line and an extension of the existing side yard line on that side of the lot leading most directly to the street line. [the section continues to illustrate the definition of yards]

The condition affecting front yard development of accessory buildings makes it permissible at Council's discretion only where "topography or natural or built features on the lot or the street(s) providing access to the lot make it practically impossible to locate an accessory building in a side or rear yard." That condition has been found to be overly restrictive. This amendment makes it possible for Council to consider such a discretionary approval under any circumstances.

The said amendment to the TOWN OF FOGO ISLAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS 2015-2025 comes into effect on the day that this notice is published in *The Newfoundland and Labrador Gazette*. Registered Nurses Regulations (Amendment) under the Registered Nurses Act, 2008

(Filed April 3, 2023)

1. Section 2 of the *Registered Nurses Regulations* is amended by adding immediately after paragraph (a) the following:

- (a.1) "employer sponsor" means
 - (i) a regional health authority established under the *Regional Health Authorities Act*, or
 - (ii) a person or body approved by the council or the executive director;
- 2. (1) Subsection 3(1) of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) deleting the words "he or she" wherever they appear and substituting the words "the person"; and
 - (b) deleting the words "his or her" and substituting the word "the".
 - (2) Subsection 3(2) of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) deleting the words "who obtained his or her education" and substituting the words "whose education was obtained"; and
 - (b) deleting the words "he or she" and substituting the words "the person".

(3) Subsection 3(3) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

- (3) A person applying to be registered as a registered nurse whose nursing education was obtained outside Canada shall, in addition to the requirements in subsection (1),
 - (a) submit a transcript from the educational institution where the person's nursing education was completed;
 - (b) provide written confirmation of the contents of the nursing education program that the person completed, including hours spent in each area of the program and other information required by the council;
 - (c) submit a letter of good standing from each jurisdiction where the person is currently, or was previously, registered or licensed; and
 - (d) submit a professional reference satisfactory to the council.
- (4) Subsection 3(4) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "the person completed his or her nursing education" and substituting the words "the person's nursing education was completed".
- (5) Subsection 3(5) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:
- (5) Notwithstanding subsection (3), a person applying to be registered to practise nursing may be registered in accordance with subsection (6) where all of the following apply:
 - (a) the person's nursing education was obtained outside Canada;
 - (b) at the time of application the person is not practising in Canada; and
 - (c) the person cannot provide evidence satisfactory to the council of the person's nursing education or registration from each jurisdiction where the person is currently, or was previously, registered or licensed.

- (6) Subsection 3(6) of the regulations is amended by
- (a) deleting the words "he or she" and substituting the words "the person"; and
- (b) deleting the words "his or her" and substituting the words "the person's".
- 3. (1) Subsection 4(1) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "he or she" and substituting the words "the person".
- (2) Subsection 4(4) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "his or her" and substituting the words "the person's".
- 4. Subsection 5(1) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "he or she" wherever they appear and substituting the words "the person".
 - 5. Subsection 5.1(2) of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) deleting the words "he or she" wherever they appear and substituting the words "the person"; and
 - (b) deleting the words "his or her" and substituting the words "the person's".
- 6. (1) Subsection 6(1) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

Interim licence

- $\mathbf{6.}\ (1)\ \mathrm{A}$ person may be granted an interim licence where the person is
 - (a) registered on the provisional register; or
 - (b) registered in accordance with section 3 and meets the requirements in paragraphs 5(1)(a) and (b) but does not meet the requirements in paragraph 5(1)(c).
- (2) Subsection 6(2) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "he or she" and substituting the words "the person".
- (3) Section 6 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (2) the following:

- (2.1) Where a person is granted an interim licence under paragraph 6(1)(b), the person shall
 - (a) practise as a registered nurse for at least 450 hours within the 24 month period following the date of issuance of the interim licence or another time approved by the council; and
 - (b) provide proof satisfactory to the council of an employer sponsor.
 - 7. Section 7 of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) deleting the words "he or she" wherever they appear and substituting the words "the person"; and
 - (b) deleting the words "his or her" wherever they appear and substituting the words "the person's".
- 8. The regulations are amended by adding immediately after section 7 the following:

Authority to prescribe

- **7.1** (1) A licence issued to a registered nurse under section 5 may include the authority to prescribe where the registered nurse provides the following:
 - (a) satisfactory proof of the successful completion of a registered nurse prescribing education program approved by the council;
 - (b) proof satisfactory to the council of an employer sponsor; and
 - (c) a declaration from the registered nurse stating that the registered nurse will only prescribe in accordance with the standards established by the council.
- (2) A registered nurse whose licence includes the authority to prescribe may, in accordance with the standards established by the council,
 - (a) prescribe a drug;
 - (b) order laboratory or other permitted tests; and

- (c) make referrals to other health professions, including medical practitioners licensed under the *Medical Act, 2011*.
- 9. Paragraph 8(1)(b) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "he or she" and substituting the words "the registered nurse".
- 10. (1) Subsection 9(1) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "he or she" wherever they appear and substituting the words "the registered nurse".
- (2) Subsection 9(2) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:
- (2) Where a registered nurse who has not written the nurse practitioner examination is granted an interim licence, the registered nurse shall write the exam at the first available sitting or at another time approved by the council.
- (3) Section 9 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (2) the following:
- (2.1) A registered nurse may be granted interim licensure to practise as a nurse practitioner where the registered nurse meets the requirements in paragraph 8(1)(a) but does not meet the requirements in paragraph 8(1)(b).
- (2.2) Where a registered nurse is granted an interim licence under subsection (2.1), the registered nurse shall
 - (a) practise as a nurse practitioner for at least 900 hours within the 36 month period following the date of issuance of the interim licence or another time approved by the council; and
 - (b) provide proof satisfactory to the council of an employer sponsor.
- 11. Subsection 10(1) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "his or her" and substituting the words "the registered nurse's".

- 12. Paragraph 11(1)(b) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "his or her" and substituting the words "the registered nurse's".
 - 13. (1) Section 12 of the regulations is amended by
 - (a) deleting the words "he or she" wherever they appear and substituting the words "the person"; and
 - (b) deleting the words "his or her" wherever they appear and substituting the word "the person's".
- (2) Section 12 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (3) the following:
- (4) Where a licence to practise nursing referred to in subsection (1) includes authority to prescribe, the person applying for a renewal shall, in addition to the requirements in subsection (1),
 - (a) submit proof satisfactory to the council of an employer sponsor; and
 - (b) provide a declaration that the person will only prescribe in accordance with the standards established by the council.
- 14. Subsection 16(3) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "he or she" and substituting the words "the Director of Professional Conduct Review".
- 15. Subsection 19(2) of the regulations is amended by deleting the words "his or her" and substituting the words "the member's".

 - (a) deleting the words "his or her" wherever they appear and substituting the words "the person's"; and

Short title

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Tourist Accommodations Regulations*.

Definitions

- 2. In these regulations
 - (a) "Act" means the Tourist Accommodations Act;
 - (b) "former Act" means the Tourist Establishments Act; and
 - (c) "platform operator" means a person who facilitates or brokers reservations for the short term rental of tourist accommodations and who receives compensation in connection with a person making or completing a reservation for a short term rental.

Registration

- **3.** (1) An operator shall apply to the minister to register a tourist accommodation before commencing operations.
- (2) An application under subsection (1) shall be in a form set by the minister and shall include
 - (a) the legal name of the operator;
 - (b) the operating name of the tourist accommodation, if any;
 - (c) the address of the tourist accommodation;
 - (d) the type of accommodation offered;
 - (e) the number of units offered for short term rental in the tourist accommodation;
 - (f) the total number of bedrooms contained in all units offered for short term rental in the tourist accommodation; and
 - (g) any additional information required by the minister.
- (3) Where an operator operates more than one tourist accommodation, the operator shall submit a separate application to register each tourist accommodation.
- (4) The minister shall register a tourist accommodation where the operator satisfies the requirements in this section.

(5) Registration of a tourist accommodation is not transferable or assignable.

Operator to notify minister **4.** Where information provided to the minister by an operator under the Act or these regulations has changed, the operator shall provide updated information to the minister, in writing, within 60 days.

Cancellation

- 5. A registration of a tourist accommodation may be cancelled where
 - (a) an operator notifies the minister that the operator has ceased to operate the tourist accommodation; or
 - (b) the minister determines that the tourist accommodation is no longer being operated.

Disclosure of information

- **6.** The minister may disclose information collected under the Act or these regulations
 - (a) to a person where the disclosure is necessary for the administration or enforcement of the Act and these regulations;
 - (b) to a public body as defined in the *Access to Information and Protection of Privacy Act, 2015* for the purpose of the public body administering or enforcing an Act of the province; and
 - (c) to a platform operator for the purpose of confirming registration of a tourist accommodation under the Act where the platform operator has signed an agreement to comply with conditions set by the minister.

Transitional

- 7. (1) Where a person who is required to register a tourist accommodation under the Act holds a valid licence in respect of the tourist accommodation under the former Act on the coming into force of these regulations, the tourist accommodation is considered registered under these regulations.
- (2) Where a person who is required to register a tourist accommodation under the Act submitted an application for a licence in respect of the tourist accommodation under the former Act and the licence has not been issued or refused on the coming into force of these

regulations, it shall be considered to be an application for a registration of the tourist accommodation under these regulations.
