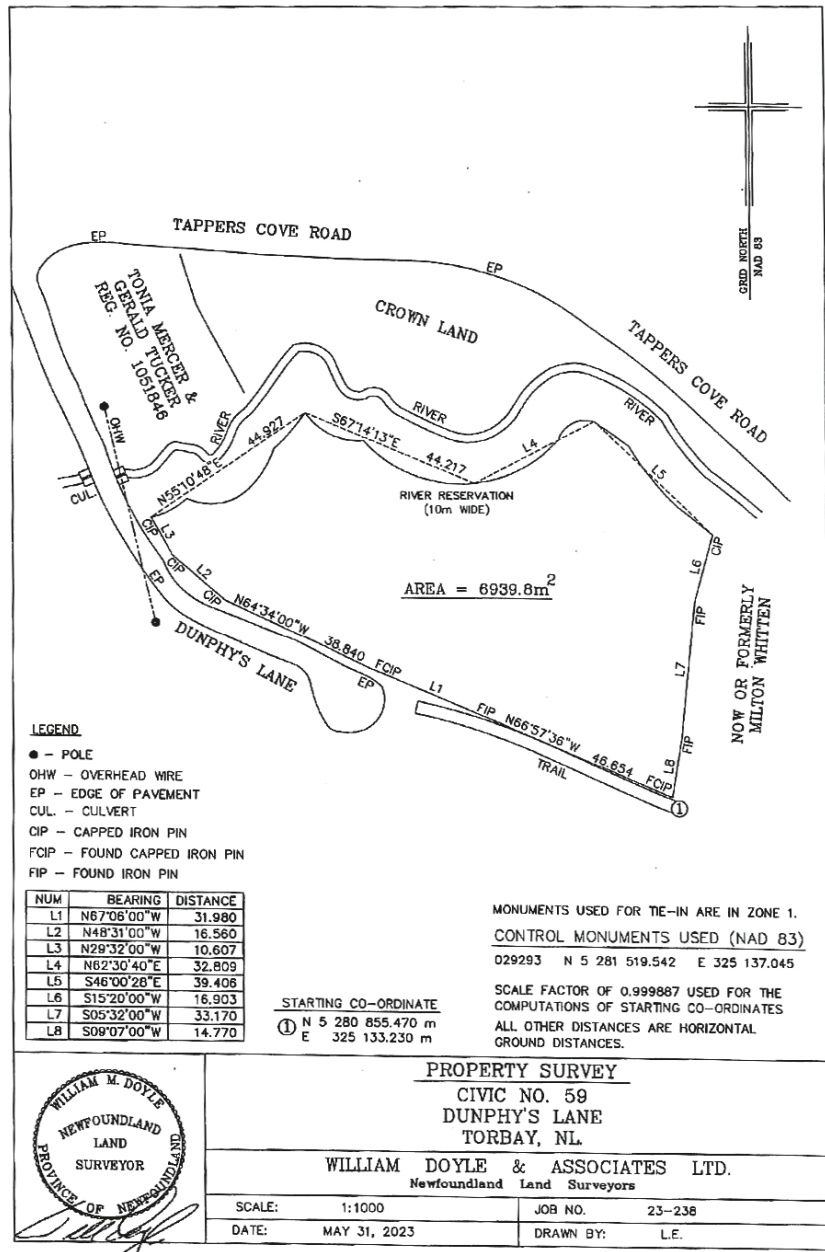

The plan includes a mix of residential housing forms and commercial buildings primarily situated along Kenmount Road.
