# INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this Guide is to provide assistance with understanding the Occupational Health and Safety Regulations. It provides information to help clarify the intent of certain sections of the Regulations and to provide answers, in plain language, to commonly asked questions about the Regulations.

# This Guide is only an explanation of the Regulations. It is not a legal document.

In determining your rights and obligations under the Regulations, you must refer to the specific sections in the Regulations. In the event of a difference between this Guide and the Regulations, the Regulations prevail.

The reader should be aware that, unless otherwise stated, any reference to a code, standard or guideline is to the most recent version of that document. This is relevant because these documents are updated periodically.

The Guide contains many illustrations that are intended to help the reader understand the requirements of the OHS Regulations, as well as to provide clarification for this Guide. The illustrations are not intended to depict exactly what is required to comply with the OHS Regulations, rather to identify possibilities that may assist in formulating an appropriate solution to a particular situation that may be identified at a workplace.

The Guide is meant to correspond to the Regulations' Parts and Sections. The Guide is divided into 27 Parts and each part is then divided into the applicable section that corresponds to the numbering in the Regulations. In the Guide, each section number is preceded by the letter "E" to distinguish the explanation from that section of the Regulations.

There is an index located at the beginning of each Part of the Guide. It contains an inventory of the explanations provided within that Part. Here you will find the section number, the section title and the date of the most recent update in that section of the Guide.
