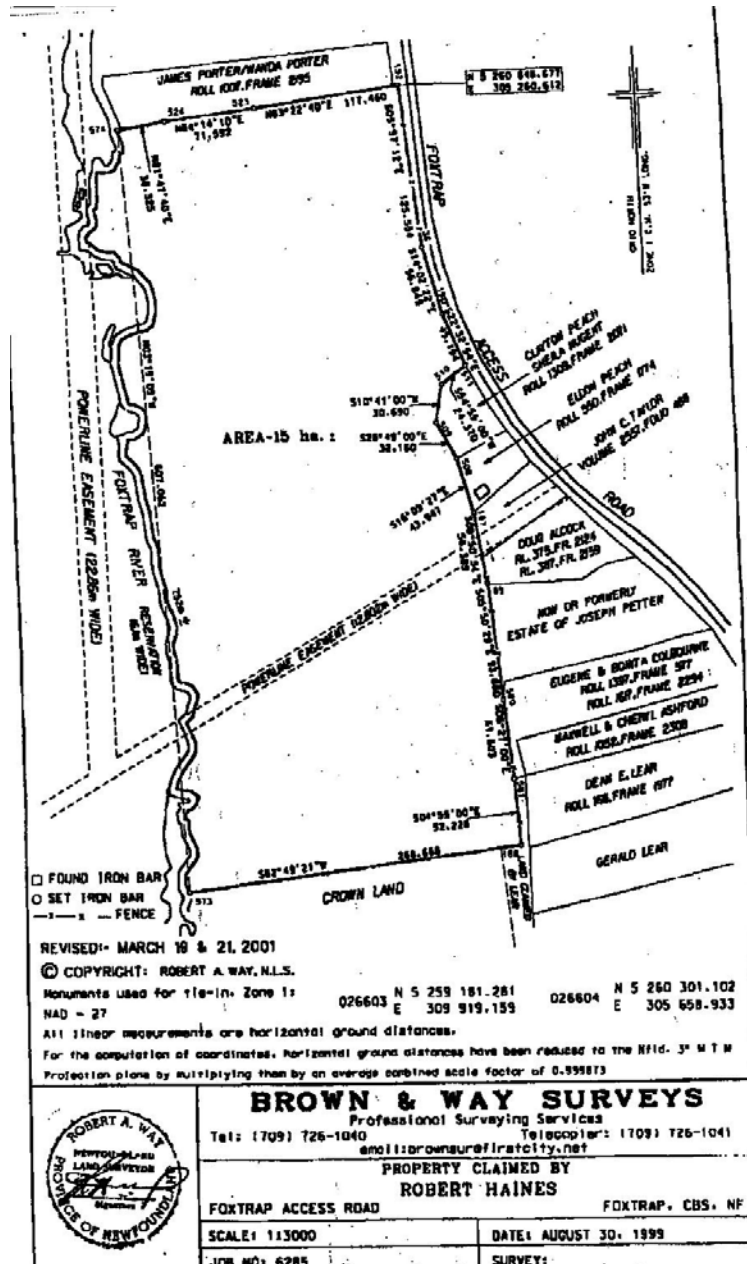

CALL FOR BIDS No. NF01-1**

The Canada-Newfoundland Offshore Petroleum Board hereby gives notice of a call for the submission of bids in respect of fourteen parcels in the Newfoundland offshore area.

This notice of the Call for Bids No. NF01-1 is made pursuant and subject to the *Canada-Newfoundland Atlantic Accord Implementation Act*, S.C., 1987, c. 3, and the *Canada-Newfoundland Atlantic Accord Implementation Newfoundland Act*, R.S.N. 1990, c. C-2.

The following is a summary of the Call for Bids No. NF01-1:

- (i) Sealed bids will be received by the Board prior to the time of closing of this call for bids. This call for bids will close at 4:00 p.m., Newfoundland Standard Time, on November 20, 2001;
- (ii) All bids must be submitted in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Call for Bids No. NF01-1;
- (iii) The fourteen parcels are located offshore Newfoundland and are described in Schedule I. Exploration Licences may be issued for each parcel.
- (iv) For the purpose of selecting a bid, the sole criterion to be used will be the total amount of money the bidder commits to expend on exploration on the respective parcel within Period I ("Work **Expenditure Bid**");
- (v) A minimum bid of \$250 thousand will be required for each parcel in the area adjacent to the west coast of the Province and a minimum bid of \$1 million for each parcel in all other portions of the offshore area;

- (vi) For each parcel, the Work Expenditure Bid must be accompanied by a **bank draft or certified cheque** in the amount of \$10,000 ("Bid Deposit") made payable to the Receiver General. Furthermore, the successful bidder will be required to provide, within 15 days of notification of being the successful bidder, a promissory note in the amount of 25% of the Work Expenditure Bid ("Security Deposit"). A credit against the Security Deposit will be made on the basis of 25% of allowable expenditures as described in Schedule III of the Exploration Licence ("Allowable Expenditures");
- (vii) Each successful bidder will receive a refund, without interest, of the Bid Deposit when the Security Deposit is posted within 15 days. **Failure to post the Security Deposit within 15 days will result in forfeiture of the Bid Deposit and disqualification of the bid.**

Upon the announcement of the bid results, the Bid Deposits of unsuccessful bidders will be returned, without interest, as soon as possible;

- (viii) For each parcel, an Exploration Licence will be issued for a term of nine years consisting of two consecutive periods of five years (Period I) and four years (Period II);
- (ix) For each parcel, the licence requirement will be one well to be commenced within Period I and diligently pursued thereafter.

The interest owner shall commence the drilling of the well within Period I, and diligently pursue such drilling thereafter, as a condition precedent to obtaining tenure during Period II;

- (x) For each parcel, rentals will be applicable only in Period II at the following rates:

Area A Parcels

Parcel No. 7
(that portion south of 47°10'N)

1st year - \$ 5.00 per hectare
2nd year - \$10.00 per hectare
3rd year - \$15.00 per hectare
4th year - \$15.00 per hectare

Area B Parcels

portion of Parcel No. 7 north of 47°10'N

1st year - \$2.50 per hectare

When an Exploration Licence continues in force beyond Period II, rentals will be payable at the rates applicable during the last year of Period II.

Rentals will be payable annually, in advance, and are to be submitted by cheque payable to the Receiver General, except for rentals applicable to an Exploration Licence continuing beyond Period II, which will be payable monthly, in advance, at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12) of the applicable annual rates.

Rentals will be refunded annually, to a maximum of 100% of the rentals paid in that year, on the basis of a dollar refund for each dollar of Allowable Expenditures for that year.

Carry forward provisions to reduce rentals otherwise payable in ensuing rental years will apply.

Rentals will apply to lands subject to a declaration of significant discovery during the term of the Exploration Licence at the rates and levels of refundability specified above;

- (xi) An Allowable Expenditure schedule will have application throughout Period I of the Exploration Licence. The rates of Allowable Expenditures will be reviewed, and may be amended, at the expiration of Period I;

- (xii) A successful bidder will be required to comply with the Canada-Newfoundland Benefits procurement, employment and reporting procedures as established by the Board;
- (xiii) The parcels will be subject to the payment of issuance fees and Environmental Studies Research Fund levies;
- (xiv) The Board is not obliged to accepted any bid or issue an interest as a result of this call for bids;
- (xv) Any licence that may be issued shall be in the form of the Exploration Licence attached to the Call for Bids NF01-1;

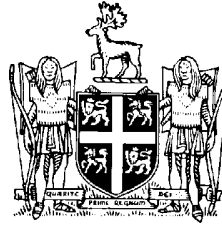

Special or
extraordinary
expenses

7. (1) In an order for child support the court may, on either parent's request, provide for an amount to cover the following expenses, or a portion of those expenses, which expenses may be estimated, taking into account the necessity of the expense in relation to the child's best interests and the reasonableness of the expense in relation to the means of the parents and those of the child and to the family's spending pattern prior to the separation:

- (a) child care expenses incurred as a result of the custodial parent's employment, illness, disability or education or training for employment;
- (b) the portion of medical and dental insurance premiums attributable to the child;
- (c) health-related expenses that exceed insurance reimbursement by at least \$100 annually, including orthodontic treatment, professional counselling provided by a psychologist, social worker, psychiatrist or other person, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy and prescription drugs, hearing aids, glasses and contact lenses;
- (d) extraordinary expenses for primary or secondary school education or for educational programs that meet the child's particular needs;
- (e) expenses for post secondary education; and
- (f) extraordinary expenses for extracurricular activities.

3. Section 12 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after the word "circumstances" where it first occurs, the words "that gives rise to the making of a variation order in respect of an order for child support".

4. Section 14 of the regulations is amended by striking out the words "Revenue Canada" and substituting the words "Canada Customs and Revenue Agency".

5. Subsection 15(1) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

Pattern of income

15. (1) Where a court is of the opinion that the determination of a parent's annual income under section 14 would not be the fairest determination of that income, the court may have regard to the parent's income over the last 3 years and determine an amount that is fair and reasonable in light of any pattern of income, fluctuation in income or receipt of a non-recurring amount during those years.

6. Paragraph 17(1)(h) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

- (h) the parent derives a significant portion of income from dividends, capital gains or other sources that are taxed at a lower rate than employment or business income or that are exempt from tax; and

7. (1) Paragraph 19(1)(b) of the regulations is amended by striking out the word "or" where it first occurs and substituting the word "and".

(2) Subsection 19(1) of the regulations is amended by striking out the word "and" at the end of paragraph (f), striking out the period at the end of paragraph (g) and substituting a semi-colon and the word "and" and by adding immediately after paragraph (g) the following:

- (h) where the parent receives income from employment insurance, social assistance, a pension, workers' compensation, disability payments or other source, the most recent statement of income indicating the total amount of income from the applicable source during the current year, or if such a statement is not provided, a letter from the appropriate authority stating the required information.

8. Section 21 of the regulations is amended by striking out the word "spouse" and replacing it with the word "parent".

9. (1) Paragraph 1(a) of Schedule A to the regulations is repealed.

(2) Paragraph 1(d) of Schedule A to the regulations is amended by striking out the words "Revenue Canada" and substituting the words "Canada Customs and Revenue Agency".

10. (1) Paragraph 1(a) of Schedule B to the regulations is repealed.

(2) Section 1 of Schedule B to the regulations is amended by adding the following immediately after paragraph (f):

(f.1) paragraph 8(1)(h) concerning motor vehicle travel expenses;

(3) Paragraph 1(i) of Schedule B to the regulations is amended by striking out the word "spouse" and replacing it with the word "parent".

(4) Section 2 of Schedule B to the regulations is amended by striking out the words "Revenue Canada" and substituting the words "Canada Customs and Revenue Agency".

4. Deduct social assistance income that is not attributable to the parent.

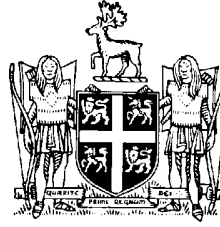

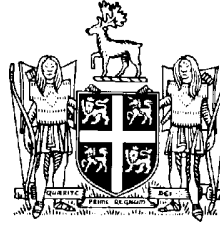

 - (i) show
 - (A) proof of graduation from a Level II full-time dental assistants' training program, which is
 - (I) recognized by the board,
 - (II) fully accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of Canada or a successor organization, and
 - (III) providing a program with the necessary training in the intra-oral duties set out in subsection 21(3), and
 - (B) evidence satisfactory to the board that the applicant holds a National Dental Assisting Examining Board (NDAEB) Certificate, or
 - (ii) show
 - (A) proof of graduation from a non-accredited Level II dental assistants' training program which is

- (I) fully recognized by the board, and
 - (II) providing a program with the necessary training in the intra-oral duties set out in subsection 21(3), and
 - (B) evidence satisfactory to the board that the applicant holds a National Dental Assisting Examining Board (NDAEB) Certificate; and
 - (e) comply with other requirements that the board considers appropriate.
- (2) The training program referred to in clause (1)(d)(i)(A) shall be of at least one year academic duration, and shall involve both didactic and clinical components.
- (3) In the event that the applicant graduated from the training program more than 3 years before the application, and has not practised as a licensed Level II dental assistant during that period, the applicant may be required to pass examinations, complete an upgrading program, or both, as required by the board.
- (4) In addition to meeting the requirements of subparagraph (1)(d)(ii) an applicant may be subject to a practical evaluation approved by the board.
- (5) An applicant applying for registration and licensure as a dental assistant who demonstrates to the satisfaction of the board that he or she has completed 900 hours of clinical practise as a dental assistant in the previous 3 years is exempt from the requirements of paragraph 7(1)(d).

3. Section 8 of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

Renewal of licence

- 8.** A registered dental auxiliary shall have a licence renewed upon
- (a) payment of the renewal fee prescribed by the board;
 - (b) proof that the auxiliary is in good standing with the board as defined in section 26;

- (c) in the case of a dental hygienist whose licence has not been renewed for 3 years or who has not practised for the same period, successful completion of an upgrading course which includes clinical and didactic content as prescribed by the board;
- (d) in the case of a dental hygienist, proof of current membership in good standing in the Newfoundland Dental Hygienists' Association;
- (e) in the case of a Level II dental assistant whose licence has not been renewed for 3 years or who has not practised for the same period, successful completion of an upgrading course which includes clinical and didactic content as prescribed by the board;
- (f) in the case of a Level II dental assistant, proof of current membership in good standing in the Newfoundland Dental Assistants' Association; and
- (g) evidence satisfactory to the board of compliance with guidelines of the mandatory continuing education.

4. Subsection 21(3) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

(3) A Level II dental assistant who is registered and licensed by the board may provide the services enumerated in subsection (1) in the manner provided for in subsection (2), and may in addition, under the direct supervision of a practitioner licensed under the Act, perform the following services:

- (a) carry out the exposure, processing and mounting of dental radiographs;
- (b) take preliminary impressions for study casts;
- (c) provide dental nutritional counselling;
- (d) provide topical application of anticariogenic agents;
- (e) take and record vital signs;

- (f) apply desensitizing agents;
- (g) application and removal of rubber dams;
- (h) application and removal of matrices and wedges;
- (i) selective rubber cup polishing;
- (j) oral hygiene instruction;
- (k) application of treatment lines, excluding pulpal involvement;
and
- (l) in relation to orthodontic module, where a Level II dental assistant has successfully completed the appropriate training as required under section 7,
 - (i) preparation of tooth surface for placement of orthodontic bands,
 - (ii) place and remove separators,
 - (iii) fit orthodontic bands before cementation,
 - (iv) remove orthodontic attachments,
 - (v) cement orthodontic bands,
 - (vi) remove excess cement with hand instruments,
 - (vii) positioning and exposing of extra-oral films,
 - (viii) tying in of archwires fitted by orthodontist,
 - (ix) removal of orthodontic archwires, and
 - (x) adaptation and removal of orthodontic ligatures.
