TOWN OF GRAND FALLS-WINDSOR TAXI REGULATIONS

Amendment #4

The following amendments to the Town of Grand Falls-Windsor Taxi Regulations are recommended to accommodate the licensing of a passenger van with wheelchair accessibility as a taxi:-

Repeal and substitute Regulation 2 (m)

2. (m)"Taxicab" means a motor vehicle other than a bus or school bus, within the meaning of the *Highway Traffic Act*, used to transport passengers for compensation.

Add Regulation 19 (1) (b)

19. (1) (b) with all equipment as required under the *Highway Traffic Act*.

Add to Regulations 19 (1) (a)

or shall have the name of the taxi stand and telephone number printed on the sides of the vehicle in letters of not less than six (6) inches in height.

Amend Regulation 23 to read Regulation 23 (1) and Add Regulation 23 (2)

- 23. (1) Every Taxicab operated under these Regulations is required to be submitted to a mechanical inspection at intervals of not more than four (4) months at an approved Motor Vehicle Inspection Station, and a copy of the certificate of mechanical fitness shall be filed with the Town Manager/Clerk within three (3) days of said inspection.
 - (2) Taxis with special equipment such as ramps or power lifts, are required to submit to a Commercial Motor Vehicle inspection at intervals of not more than four (4) months, at an approved Motor Vehicle Inspection Station, a copy of the certificate of

mechanical fitness shall be filed with the Town Manager/Clerk within three (3) days of said inspection.

TOWN OF GRAND FALLS-WINDSOR

Pursuant to authority conferred by Sections 413 and 414 of the *Municipalities Act, S.N. 1999*, the Town Council of Grand Falls-Windsor, Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, has made the following regulations.

DOG REGULATIONS

- These Regulations shall be known and cited as The Town of Grand Falls-Windsor Dog Regulations, 2001.
- In these Regulations the following words, unless the context otherwise requires, shall have the following meaning:
 - (a) "Council" means Grand Falls-Windsor Town Council;
 - (b) "Dog" means a male or female dog or pup and includes an animal which is a cross between a dog and a wolf;
 - (c) "Impounder" means a person or persons appointed by the Council or the Town Manager /Clerk, authorized to impound any animal which is without an owner, is not in the company of an owner, or any animal of which the owner has infringed upon any provisions of these Regulations;
 - (d) "Injured" and "Injury" include, but are not limited to, injuries caused by wounding, worrying, terrifying or pursuing;
 - (e) "Kennel" means an establishment for the keeping, breeding or boarding of dogs;
 - (f) "Municipal Enforcement Officer" means for the purposes of these Regulations a Peace Officer with powers as outlined in the *Municipalities Act, 1999*;
 - (g) "Owner", when used with reference to the ownership of a dog, includes any person who owns, harbours, has custody, has possession or has charge of a house or premises or part of premises where any dog is kept or permitted to live or remain;
 - (h) "Town" means the Town of Grand Falls-Windsor.
- No person shall keep a dog in the Town unless a license
 has been issued by the Council for such dog and such
 license is still in force, and unless such dog bears a
 numbered tag or plate indicating that such license is in
 force.

- No person shall breed dogs under any circumstance, unless a license has been issued by the Town. This license has to be renewed each time the animal is bred.
- No person shall lead, have or take a dog in or to any public place in the Town unless such dog bears a numbered tag or plate indicating that a license has been issued for such dog by the Town or by another Municipality.
- 6. (a) Every license issued by the Town after April 5th, 1994 shall have no expiry date and shall be non-transferable:
 - (b) The fee payable for a license shall be \$10.00 for a neutered male or for a spayed female dog; the fee payable for an unneutered male or for an unspayed female dog shall be \$30.00;
 - (c) The fee payable for a license to operate a kennel within the Town shall be \$50.00;
 - (d) The owner of every licensed dog shall immediately on receipt of the license tag, attach it to a strong and durable collar, which collar shall be kept upon the dog's neck at all times.
 - (e) The fee payable for a license to breed a dog is \$50.00 for each time the animal is bred.
- 7. Any dog found at large in the Town contrary to these Regulations may be humanely destroyed by the impounder at the expiration of two (2) days after the time of impounding.
- 8. Any court of summary jurisdiction may take cognizance of a complaint that a dog is dangerous and not kept under proper control or has bitten or attempted to bite any persons and if it appears to the court that the dog is dangerous or has done any of the things referred to herein, the court may order the owner of the dog to destroy it.
- Any person authorized to destroy a dog under these Regulations may destroy or may complain to a Provincial Court Judge who, upon verification of the authorization, may make an order directing the owner of the dog to destroy it.
- 10. The owner of a dog who fails to comply with an order made under either Regulation 8 or 9 shall be deemed to have committed an offence in terms of these Regulations.
- 11. No person shall establish a kennel or carry on any business or institution for boarding, keeping, training or treating dogs unless the permission of the Council in writing has been obtained therefore.
- 12. If any dog while not in the company of its owner or a member of its owner's household is found in any public

place or any private property without the consent of the owner, occupant or person having control of such property, the owner of such dog as well as the person who caused the dog to be in such a place shall be deemed to have committed an offence in terms of these Regulations.

- 13. If any dog shall bite any person other than its owner or a member of its owner's household and while not in its owner's premises, such dog shall be deemed to be a nuisance and the owner thereof shall be deemed to have committed an offence in terms of these Regulations.
- 14. If any dog shall cause damage to any lawn, grass plot, garden or flower bed or flower, shrub or plant, or if a dog causes garbage placed for collection to be disturbed, such dog shall be deemed to be a nuisance and the owner thereof shall be deemed to have committed an offence in terms of these Regulations.
- 15. If any dog shall bark or howl in such manner as to disturb the peace or to constitute an annoyance to residents in the neighbourhood, such dog shall be deemed to be a nuisance and the owner thereof shall be deemed to have committed an offence in terms of these Regulations.
- 16. Whenever a dog is found in any public place or on any private property without the consent of the owner, occupant or person having control of such private property or without a tag or plate as required by Regulation 4 preceding or is not accompanied as required by Regulation 12 preceding or is not held securely on a leash by a person capable of restraining its movements or confined to private property, the impounder shall and any person may cause the dog to be impounded.
- 17. (a) When a dog, which bears a numbered tag or plate as required by these Regulations has been impounded, the impounder shall, if possible, give notice thereof to the licensee or owner of the dog if the name and address of such persons are known to him and if the dog has not been redeemed by or on behalf of the licensee or owner within two (2) days after the dispatch of such notice, or where no notice has been given, after the time of impounding, the impounder shall cause the dog to be disposed of or humanely destroyed;
 - (b) The fee which shall be paid to the impounder for the redemption of an impounded dog shall be \$50.00:
 - (c) When a dog which does not bear a numbered tag or plate, as required by these Regulations, has been impounded, the impounder shall cause the dog to be disposed of or humanely destroyed at the

- expiration of forty-eight (48) hours after the time of impounding;
- (d) Where, in the sole discretion of the impounder, the dog liable to be impounded, appears to be vicious, dangerous, diseased, or otherwise unfit for impounding, the impounder may cause the dog to be disposed of or humanely destroyed forthwith;
- (e) Upon payment of the impounding fee and of the license fee described where a dog is not licensed, the impounder may release any dog which fails to be disposed of or destroyed to any person requesting such dog and the ownership of such dog shall then vest in the person to whom it is released and the former owner shall have no right or claim to such dog.
- 18. (a) No person shall keep a dog in the Town unless the dog is safety tethered or penned up at all times or kept securely on leash by a person capable of restraining its movement;
 - (b) A dog which is tethered or penned up pursuant to these Regulations shall be tethered or penned up in a manner which may not be regarded as imposing undue hardship or cruelty to the dog.
- 19. The impounder, who reports to the Town Manager/Clerk, shall:
 - (a) Report the name and address of any person observed or reliably reported to have violated any of the provisions of these Regulations;
 - (b) Report the time and nature of such violation and any other circumstances relevant thereto;
 - (c) Serve upon the person violating any of the provisions of these Regulations a serially numbered notice that such person has violated a provision of these Regulations and instructing such person where to report in regard to such violation;
 - (d) File with the Town Manager/Clerk a duplicate copy of each serially numbered notice served as aforesaid.
- 20. Any person who violates any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty as prescribed by these Regulations.
- 21. Any person who violates the provisions of Regulation 13 of these Regulations shall be liable to a minimum fine of \$150.00 or a maximum fine of \$300.00 for each and subsequent offence.
- 22. Any person who violates any provision of these Regulations for which a penalty is not specifically provided, shall be guilty of an offence and be liable upon conviction to a minimum fine of \$25.00 for a first

- offence and a maximum of \$50.00 for a second and each subsequent offence.
- Prosecution under these Regulations may be taken summarily by any Police Constable, including a Municipal Enforcement Officer.
- The Town of Grand Falls-Windsor Dog Regulations 1988 and amendments made thereunder are hereby repealed.
- These Regulations shall come into effect on the 13th day of November, 2001.
