THENCE running by land of Robert Hayward north forty two degrees thirty nine minutes thirty seconds west, fifty nine decimal four eight three meters.


THENCE running by Crown Land north fifty degrees thirty four minutes nine seconds east, twenty four decimal zero six two meters.

NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR REGULATION 32/04

Wild Life Regulations (Amendment) under the Wild Life Act (O.C. 2004-189)

(Filed April 21, 2004)

Under the authority of section 7 of the *Wild Life Act*, the minister, with the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council, makes the following regulations.

CNLR 1156/96 as amended

- 1. Paragraph 2(h) of the *Wild Life Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:
 - (h) "game" includes big game, small game, furbearing animals, coyote and porcupine;
- 2. The regulations are amended by adding immediately after section 81 the following:

PART V.1 COYOTE

Coyote licence

- **81.1** (1) The minister may, upon application by a person 16 years of age and over, issue to that person a coyote licence to take coyote by shooting, and the minister may issue a badge to that person to accompany that licence.
- (2) The holder of a coyote licence may hunt, take or kill coyote with a centre-fire rifle not greater than .225 calibre or a shotgun using shot size 2 or larger.
- (3) The minister may make the licence subject to those terms and conditions that the minister may determine.
- (4) The holder of a coyote licence may sell the whole or any part of a coyote taken under that licence.

Open season

- **81.2** (1) The minister may, by order, prescribe an open season for coyote and that order may be made to apply to the whole of the province or to a part of the province that may be specified in the order.
- (2) The minister may, by order, set a limit on the number of coyote that may be taken during an open season.

Prohibition

- **81.3** (1) Unless otherwise permitted in these regulations or in an order made under them, a person who does not hold a valid coyote licence shall not hunt, take or kill coyote.
- (2) A person who holds a coyote licence shall not hunt, take or kill coyote unless the person has his or her licence on his or her person and if a badge has been issued to him or her, wears the badge in a conspicuous manner.

- (3) A person shall not hunt, take or kill coyote on a Sunday, except in the circumstances described in subsection 107(13).
- 3. (1) Subsection 107(3) of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after the words "rim-fire rifle" the following "or coyote with a centre-fire rifle not greater than .225 calibre".
- (2) Subsection 107(5) of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after the words "rim-fire rifle" the following "or coyote with a centre-fire rifle not greater than .225 calibre".

Short title

1. This Order may be cited as the *Coyote Hunting Order Newfoundland and Labrador*, 2004.

Definition

2. In this order, "coyote shooting licence" means a licence issued under section 81.1 of the *Wild Life Regulations*.

Coyote licence holders **3.** The open season for the hunting of coyote by the holder of a coyote shooting licence is from May 1, 2004 to July 10, 2004 and from September 11, 2004 to July 9, 2005.

Other licence holders

- **4.** (1) The holder of a big game, small game or wolf shooting licence is permitted to hunt coyote by shooting, in the area and during the open season for which his or her licence is valid.
- (2) The holder of the licence referred to in subsection (1) shall only shoot coyotes using the type of firearm and ammunition that his or her licence permits.
- (3) A person who shoots coyotes with a shotgun under the authority of this section shall use shot size 2 or larger.

Specimens

5. A person who kills a coyote shall surrender the carcass to an office of the Inland Fish and Wildlife Division within 14 days of the date of the kill and may keep or sell the skin.

Limit

6. There is no limit on the number of coyotes which may be shot by the holder of a coyote shooting licence or by a person under the authority of section 4.

Identification

7. A person shall not transport or possess any firearm under the authority of a valid game licence without being in possession of an outdoor identification card, or non-resident equivalent card, issued to that person.

Repeal

8. The Coyote Hunting Order Newfoundland and Labrador, NLR 76/02, is repealed.
