CRIMINAL CODE OF CANADA

ATTORNEY GENERAL OF NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR ANNUAL REPORT SECTION 83 - PART II.1 TERRORISM *Criminal Code* of Canada

For the period December 24, 2003 to December 24, 2004.

Section 83 of the *Criminal Code* requires that the Attorney General of every province shall publish, or otherwise make available to the public, an Annual Report for the previous year on the operation of sections 83.28, 83.29 and 83.3. The specific reporting requirements are specified in section 83.31.

No actions or activities have been initiated or taken by the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary in relation to either of these sections of the *Criminal Code*.

In general terms, the purpose of Development Regulations Amendment No. 3, 2004 is to amend Zoning Plan Map 1 from Conservation to Residential Medium Density on the Hansen Highway to accommodate one or more dwellings and to amend Zoning Plan Map 2 from Commercial General to Public Assembly and Institutional on Minnesota Drive to accommodate a senior's complex.

Labour Standards Regulations (Amendment) under the Labour Standards Act (O.C. 2005-034)

(Filed February 18, 2005)

Under the authority of sections 26 and 27 of the *Labour Standards Act*, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council makes the following regulations.

1. Section 8 of the *Labour Standards Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:

Minimum wage

8. (1) Effective June 1, 2005, every employer shall pay to every employee a wage rate of not less than \$6.25 an hour.

(2) Effective January 1, 2006, every employer shall pay to every employee a wage rate of not less than \$6.50 an hour.

(3) Effective June 1, 2006, every employer shall pay to every employee a wage rate of not less than \$6.75 an hour.

(4) Effective January 1, 2007, every employer shall pay to every employee a wage rate of not less than \$7.00 an hour.

2. Section 9 of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

Interim overtime wage **9.** (1) Effective June 1, 2005, for the purpose of section 25 of the Act, overtime wages shall be paid at a rate of not less than \$9.38 an hour.

(2) Effective January 1, 2006, for the purpose of section 25 of the Act, overtime wages shall be paid at a rate of not less than \$9.75 an hour.

(3) Effective June 1, 2006, for the purpose of section 25 of the Act, overtime wages shall be paid at a rate of not less than \$10.13 an hour.

(4) Effective January 1, 2007, for the purpose of section 25 of the Act, overtime wages shall be paid at a rate of not less than \$10.50 an hour.

(5) Notwithstanding subsections (1), (2), (3) and (4), effective April 1, 2003, for the purpose of section 25 of the Act, overtime wages shall be paid at a rate of not less than one and one half an employee's regular rate of pay to those employees subject to a collective agreement negotiated after December 6, 2001, where the collective agreement, or a letter of understanding, schedule or other correspondence between the employer and a representative of the employees, attached to or forming part of the collective agreement, references an announcement of government that, effective April 1, 2003, these regulations would be amended to require all employers to pay overtime wages at a rate of not less than one and one half an employee's regular rate of pay, notwithstanding that such an amendment has not come into effect.

(6) Section 25 of the Act does not apply to a person employed

- (a) in the planting, cultivating and harvesting of farm produce other than the production of fruit and vegetables in greenhouse and nursery operations;
- (b) in the raising of livestock; or
- (c) as a live-in housekeeper or baby-sitter where there is an arrangement by which that employee is entitled to time off with pay for hours worked in excess of 40 hours per week.

3. These regulations come into force on June 1, 2005.

1. Section 24 of the *Wooddale Agriculture Development Area Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:

Farm residential development

24. (1) Residential development shall not be permitted except where

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- (a) there is one residence for each commercial farm and that residence complies with a farm development plan approved by the authority for that farm; or
- (b) it is necessary for the efficient operation of the farm, a second residence exists that complies with a farm development plan approved by the authority for that farm.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), one residence for each actively farming son or daughter of persons who own and reside on land within the development area subject to conditions or restrictions contained in the owner's grant to the land may be permitted provided that

- (a) the location and frontage of the lot are in conformity with the municipal plan approved by the authority; and
- (b) proof of title to and residence on the land is supplied; and
- (c) a statement is supplied by the owner listing all of his or her sons and daughters who are actively farming and stating which son or daughter is to construct the residence; and
- (d) there is minimal agricultural impact from the proposed development as determined by the authority.

(3) A residence referred to in subsection (1) or (2) must be located so that it

- (a) does not interfere with access to the remainder of the land on which the farm is located; and
- (b) has at least 30 metres of frontage per residence on a publicly maintained highway.

(4) For the purpose of this section, a person shall be considered to be actively farming if he or she is engaged in commercial farming.

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
