### CANADA-NEWFOUNDLAND ATLANTIC ACCORD IMPLEMENTATION NEWFOUNDLAND ACT

#### CANADA-NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR OFFSHORE PETROLEUM BOARD

##### CALL FOR BIDS No. NL05-1

The Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Petroleum Board hereby gives notice of the term and conditions of the interests issued as a result of Call for Bids No. NF05-1. The bids selected, and the information contained on the prescribed bid forms, were published in the *Canada Gazette* Part I, on December 23, 2005.

This notice is made pursuant to and subject to the *Canada-Newfoundland Atlantic Accord Implementation Act*, S.C., 1987, c. 3, and the *Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Atlantic Accord Implementation Newfoundland and Labrador Act*, RSNL.1990, c.C-2.

Exploration Licence Nos. 1089, 1090, 1091, 1092 and 1093 were issued to the following interest owners:

The following is a summary of the terms and conditions of the above exploration licences:

1. The exploration licences confer:
  - (a) the right to explore for, and the exclusive right to drill and test for, petroleum;
  - (b) the exclusive right to develop those portions of the offshore area in order to produce petroleum; and
  - (c) the exclusive right, subject to compliance with the other provisions of the Act, to obtain a production licence.
2. The exploration licences were issued for a nine-year term effective January 15, 2006.
3. Period I is a period of five (5) years commencing on the effective date of this licence specified below. The interest owner shall commence the drilling of the well within Period I, and diligently pursue such drilling thereafter, as a condition precedent to obtaining tenure during Period II.
4. The interest owner may at its option extend Period I from five (5) years to six (6) years by posting a Drilling Deposit with the Board before the end of the fifth year of Period I. If a Drilling Deposit is posted, it will be refunded in full if the Licence is validated for Period II by the drilling of a well.

If a validation well is not drilled, the Drilling Deposit will be forfeited to the Receiver General for Canada upon the termination of the Licence. Allowable Expenditures cannot be applied against the Drilling Deposit.

5. Upon the expiration of Period II, there shall be a deemed surrender of the interest except as it relates to the lands or any portion thereof subject to a significant discovery licence, or a production licence.
6. The interest owners for the above exploration licences were required to provide the following security deposits in the form of a promissory note satisfactory to the Board:

A credit against the deposit will be made following each anniversary date of each respective exploration licence on the basis of 25% of allowable expenditures. Any deposit balance remaining at the end of Period I, or following the termination of a well commenced and being pursued diligently but not terminated within Period I, or upon the surrender of rights, will be forfeited.

7. For each licence, rentals will be applicable only in Period II at a rate of \$5.00 per hectare in respect of the first year and increasing thereafter by \$5.00 per hectare per year, up to and including the third year. Rentals for the fourth year will be \$15.00 per hectare (Jeanne d'Arc Basin).

For each licence, rentals will be applicable only in Period II at a rate of \$2.50 per hectare in respect of the first year and increasing thereafter by \$2.50 per hectare per year, up to and including the third year. Rentals for the fourth year will be \$7.50 per hectare (Western Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Region).

8. Other terms and conditions referred to in the licences include provisions respecting Allowable Expenditures, Indemnity, Liability, Successors and Assigns, Notice, Waiver and Relief, Appointment of Representative and Agreement by Interest Owners.

Short title

**1.** These regulations may be cited as the *Newfoundland and Labrador Child Benefit Regulations, 2006*.

Definitions

**2.** In these regulations

(a) "Act" means the *Income Tax Act, 2000*; and

(b) "NLCB" means the Newfoundland and Labrador child benefit as defined in paragraph 38(1)(b) of the Act.

Qualified dependent      **3.** A person who is a qualified dependent of an eligible individual on the first day of a month is a qualified dependent of that individual for that month.

Child benefit calculation      **4.** The amount of the Newfoundland and Labrador child benefit that applies for a qualified dependent of an eligible individual that is considered to have arisen during a month in relation to which the year is the base taxation year is the amount of NLCB, if it is positive, calculated according to the following formula:

$$\text{NLCB} = 1/12[(A+B+C+D)-E]$$

where:

A = \$250 for the first qualified dependent

B = \$326 for the second qualified dependent

C = \$350 for the third qualified dependent

D = \$375 times the number of qualified dependents in excess of 3; and

E = the benefit reduction calculated under section 6

Nutritional supplement benefit      **5.** An eligible individual who receives on behalf of a qualified dependent the NLCB calculated in accordance with these regulations is entitled to receive, for the 11 month period effective the first of the month following the month during which birth occurred, a supplementary benefit of \$45 a month.

Benefit reduction calculation      **6.** Where the adjusted income of an eligible individual for a base taxation year, in relation to a month

(a) is less than or equal to \$17,397, the benefit reduction "E" shall equal zero; and

(b) is greater than \$17,397, the benefit reduction "E" shall be calculated by multiplying the difference between the adjusted income and \$17,397 by

(i) 5.00% where there is one qualified dependent,

(ii) 11.52% where there are 2 qualified dependents,

(iii) 18.52% where there are 3 qualified dependents, and

(iv) the total of 18.52%, and the product obtained by multiplying the number of qualified dependents in excess of 3 by 7.5%.

**1. The *Insurance Companies Tax Regulations* are amended by adding immediately after section 4 the following:**

Returns to be filed

**4.1** (1) Unless otherwise is required by the minister under subsection (2), a company shall make a separate return of tax payable for each

calendar month and shall file the return with the minister not later than 20 days after the end of the month in respect of which the return is made together with payment of the tax payable by the company.

(2) The minister may, in addition to or instead of the returns required under subsection (1), order a company to make a return of the tax payable by that company in respect of a period prescribed by the minister in the order, and in that case, the company that has been ordered shall make the return of tax payable within the period prescribed by the minister in the order together with payment of the tax payable by the company.

(3) A return required to be made by a company under this section shall be signed by an officer, director or agent of the company or a person authorized in writing to sign on behalf of the officer, director or agent.

Prohibition

##### **Sunday Hunting Zone A - Western Region**

All that area of the Island of Newfoundland bounded by a line beginning at a point known as Friar Head in Fortune Bay;

Then following a straight line to the southwestern end of Norseman's Pond;

Then following a straight line in a northeasterly direction to a point of land, elevation 852 feet, east of Norsemans Pond at an approximate location of 48° 9' 54.3" north latitude and 54° 25' 27.8" west longitude;

Then following a straight line in a northerly direction to the northeastern extremity of Norsemans Pond;

Then following a straight line to the western extremity of Norsemans Pond;

Then following a straight line in a generally northeasterly direction to the southeastern extremity of Saddle Pond;

Then following the southwestern shoreline of Saddle Pond to the stream at its northern extremity;
