Take notice that the Town of Triton Municipal Plan Amendment No. 2, 2006 and Development Regulations Amendment No. 3, 2006 approved on the 20<sup>th</sup>. day of June, 2006, has been registered by the Minister of Municipal Affairs

In general terms, the purpose of the Municipal Plan Amendment No.2, 2006, is to add policy to the Rural Resource Land Use Designation to allow for remote seasonal cottages as a discretionary use.

Development Regulations Amendment No. 3, 2006, will add a revised Rural Resource Land Use Zone Table, with a new condition to Schedule C for remote seasonal cottages. Remote Seasonal Cottage will be added to the list of examples for the Residential Uses use class found in Schedule B, Classification of Uses of Land and Buildings.

The Town of Triton Municipal Plan Amendment No. 2, 2006 and Development Regulations Amendment No. 3, 2006, comes into effect on the day that this notice is published in *The Newfoundland and Labrador Gazette*. 



1. (1) Subsection 9(1) of the *Tax Agreement Regulations* is amended by renumbering paragraph (a) as paragraph (a.2) and by adding immediately before paragraph (a.2) the following:

- (a) "composite property" means property that is wrapped, packaged, or otherwise prepared for sale as a single product the only components of which are a printed book and
  - (i) a read-only medium that contains material all or substantially all of the value of which is reasonably attributable to one or more of the following
    - (A) a reproduction of the printed book, and
    - (B) material that makes specific reference to the printed book and the content of it and that supplements, and is integrated with, that content, or
  - (ii) if the product is specifically designed for use by students enrolled in a qualifying course, a read-only medium or a right to access a website, or both of them, that contains material that is related to the subject matter of the printed book;
- (a.1) "exempt supply" has the meaning given to it under subsection 123(1) of the *Excise Tax Act* (Canada);

### $\left(2\right)$ Paragraph 9(1) (b) of the Regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

- (b) "printed book" has the meaning given to it under subsection 259.1(1) of the *Excise Tax Act* (Canada);
- (3) Subsection 9(1) of the Regulations is amended by adding the following immediately after paragraph (b):
  - (b.1) "qualifying course" means a course instructing individuals the service of which,
    - (i) is an exempt supply included in Part III of Schedule V to the *Excise Tax Act* (Canada), or
    - (ii) would be an exempt supply included in that Part but for the fact that the supplier of the service has made an election under a section of that Part:
  - (b.2) "qualifying property" means property that is

- (i) a printed book,
- (ii) a composite property,
- (iii) an update of a printed book,
- (iv) an audio recording all or substantially all of which is a spoken reading of a printed book, or
- (v) a bound or unbound printed version of scripture of any religion;
- (b.3) "read-only medium" means a tangible medium that is designed for the read-only storage of information and other material in digital format;
- $\,$  (4) Subsections 9(2) to (5) of the Regulations are amended by replacing the references in those subsections to the phrase "printed book" with references to the phrase "qualifying property".
- (5) Subsections (1) and (2) apply for the purposes of determining a rebate in respect of tax that becomes payable on or after September 1, 2006.

- (5) A lodging house, boarding house or bed and breakfast which accommodates more than 10 boarders, lodgers or guests shall have
  - (a) at least one room with sleeping accommodations that are accessible to physically disabled persons; and
  - (b) the entrance and facilities normally used by the boarders, lodgers or guests shall be accessible to physically disabled persons.
- 4. Section 8 of the regulations is amended by deleting the figure "1%" and by substituting the figure "4%".

- 5. (1) Paragraph 9(3)(a) is repealed and the following substituted:
  - (a) the building addition contains a principal entrance;

  - (a) at least one telephone in each bank of telephones shall be accessible to persons using a wheelchair and as in subsection 34(1) of the Schedule; and
  - (b) at least one telephone in each area where telephones are provided shall be accessible for use by deaf and hard of hearing persons as in subsection 34(2) of the Schedule.
- 9. Section 14 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (1) the following:
- (1.1) The copies of drawings and specifications of design required under subsection (1) shall be submitted prior to any construction contemplated by those drawings and specification of design taking place.

#### 10. The Schedule to the regulations is amended

- (a) in subsection 1(5) by deleting the words "millimetres squared" and substituting the words "square metres";
- (b) by repealing subsection 12(2) and substituting the following:
- (2) The number of spaces designated for wheelchair use in the rooms and areas referred to in paragraph (1)(b) shall conform to Table II.
