Take notice that the Town of Conception Bay South Municipal Plan Amendment No. 26, 2008 and Development Regulation Amendment No. 31, 2008 adopted by the Town Council of Conception Bay south on September 16, 2008 and approved on December 2, 2008 has now been registered by the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

In general terms, the purpose of Municipal Plan Amendment No. 26, 2008 and Development Regulations amendment No. 31, 2008 is to re-designate and re-zone the rear portion of 939-941 Conception Bay Highway, Kelligrews, from Residential Medium Density (R-2) and Open Space Conservation (OSC) to Commercial (C-1) to

accommodate self-storage buildings. The land between the existing building and Lower Gullies River will remain designated and zoned Public (P) and a 20-metre watercourse buffer along the Lower Gullies River will remain zoned Open Space Conservation (OSC).

The Conception Bay South Municipal Plan Amendment No. 26, 2008 and Development Regulations Amendments No. 31, 2008 will come into effect on the date of publication of this notice in *The Newfoundland and Labrador Gazette*. 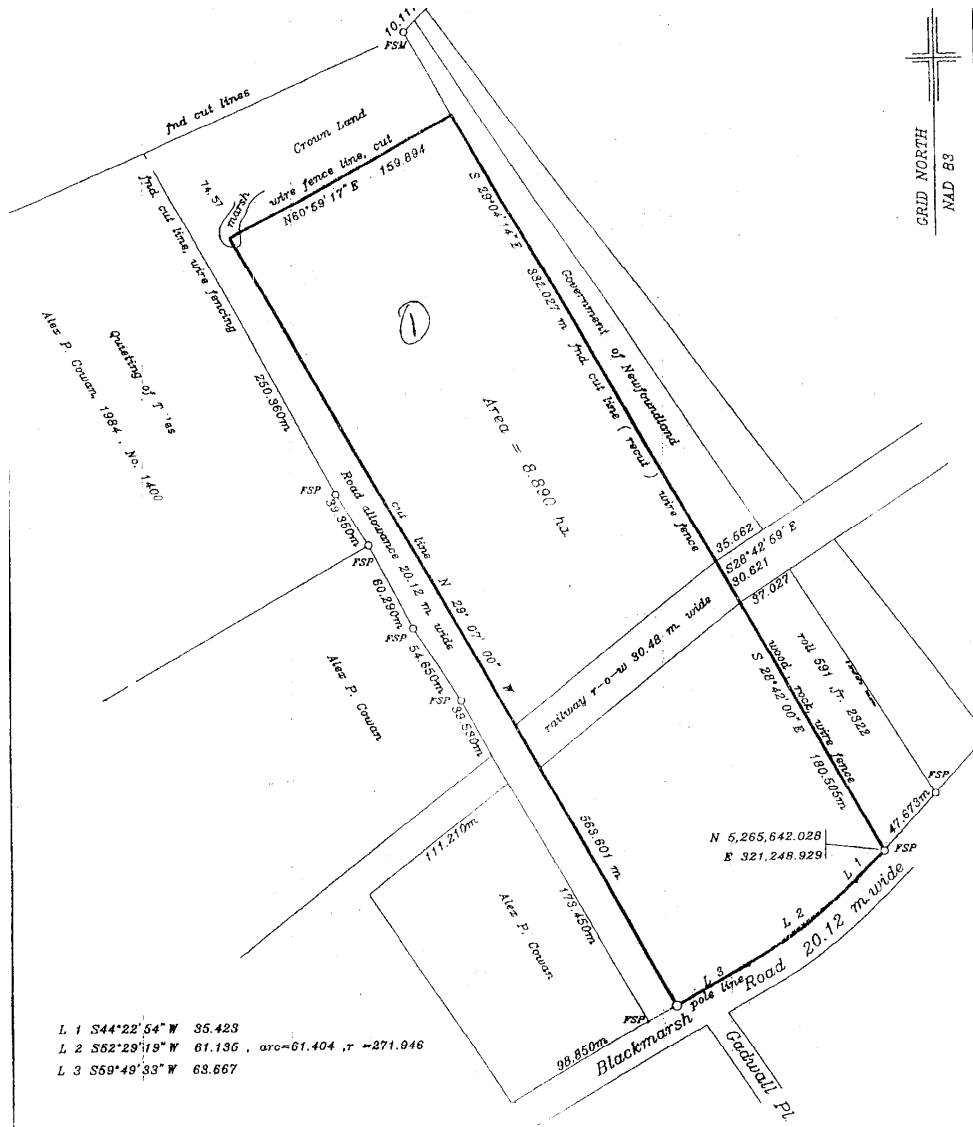

1. Subsection 14(4) of the *Wild Life Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:

(4) Notwithstanding subsection (3),

- (a) the hunting, taking and killing of furbearing animals by means of firearms is permitted in the Labrador portion of the province; and
- (b) the hunting, taking and killing of coyote, fox and lynx, by the holder of a trapper's licence using a center-fire rifle not greater than .225 calibre or a shotgun using shot size 2 or larger is permitted on the Island portion of the province.
