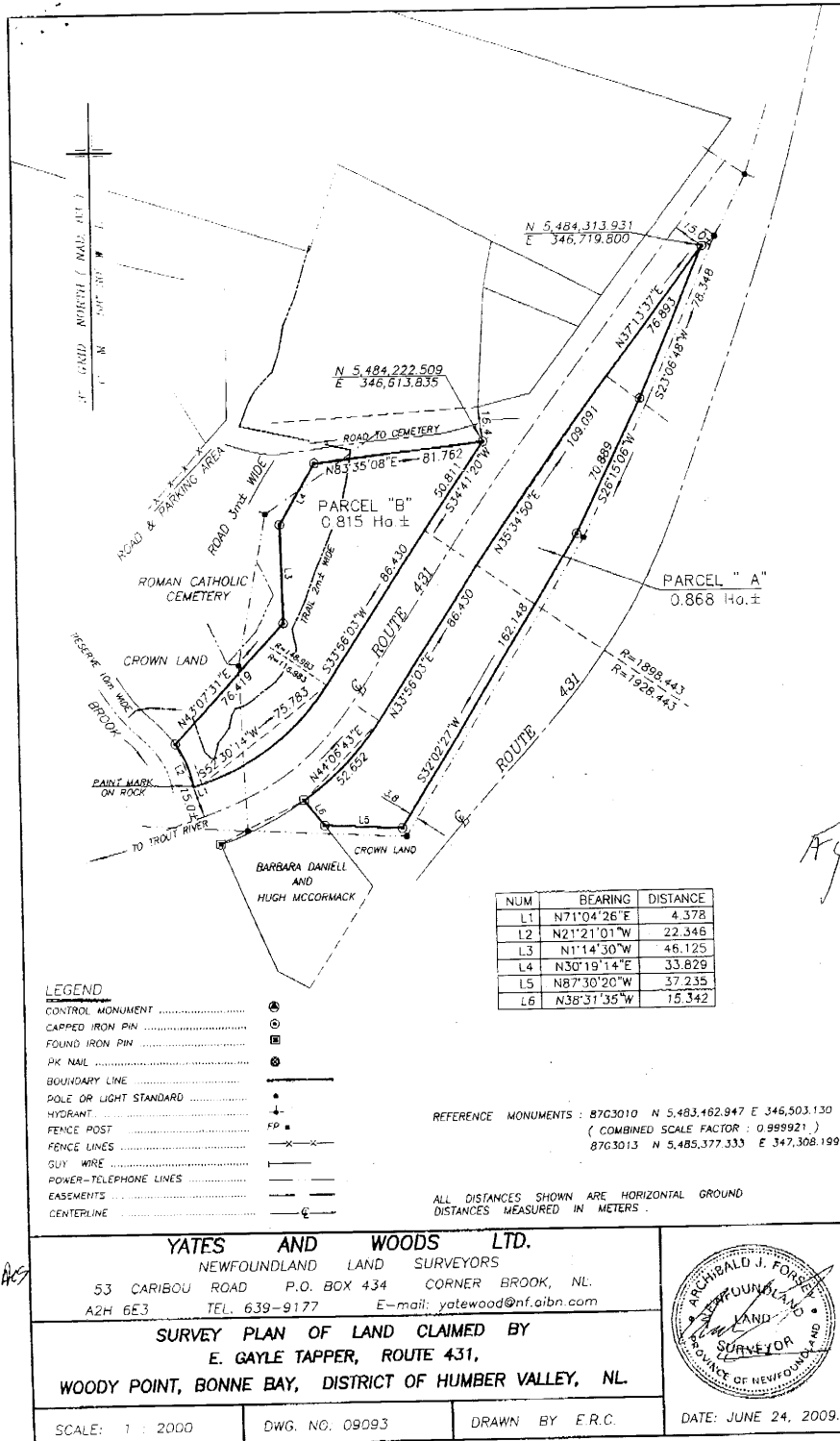

**NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR
REGULATION 19/10**

Income Tax Deduction Regulations (Amendment)
under the
Income Tax Act, 2000
(O.C. 2010-128)

(Filed April 20, 2010)

Under the authority of section 68 of the *Income Tax Act, 2000* the Lieutenant-Governor in Council makes the following regulations.
