NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR REGULATION 57/11

Health Research Ethics Authority Regulations under the Health Research Ethics Authority Act

(Filed June 21, 2011)

Under the authority of section 27 of the *Health Research Ethics Authority Act*, I make the following regulations.

Short title

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Health Research Ethics Authority Regulations*.

Definitions

- **2.** In these regulations
 - (a) "Act" means the Health Research Ethics Authority Act;

- (b) "authority" means the Health Research Ethics Authority for Newfoundland and Labrador established under section 3 of the Act;
- (c) "research ethics board" means the Health Research Ethics Board established under section 7 of the Act; and
- (d) "research ethics body" means a research ethics body approved by the authority under section 8 of the Act.

Application to engage in research

- **3.** (1) The authority shall refer all applications for approval to engage in health research involving human subjects that contain proposals for clinical trials or genetic research to the research ethics board.
- (2) The authority may refer applications for approval to engage in health research involving human subjects that do not contain proposals for clinical trials or genetic research to the research ethics board or a research ethics body.

Commencement

4. These regulations come into force on July 1, 2011.

Short title

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Low Income Tax Reduction Regulations*, 2011.

Definition

2. In these regulations, "Act" means the *Income Tax Act*, 2000.

Low income tax reduction amounts

3. For the purpose of the Act, for the 2011 taxation year

- (a) the amount referred to in paragraph 21.1(2.1)(a) is \$572; and
- (b) the amount referred to in paragraph 21.1(2.1)(b) is \$288.

Repeal

4. The *Low Income Tax Reduction Regulations*, 2010, Newfoundland and Labrador Regulation 95/10, is repealed.

Commencement

5. These regulations are considered to have come into force on January 1, 2011.

1. Section 7 of the *Child and Parental Benefits Regulations* is repealed and the following substituted:

Benefit reduction calculation

- **7.** Where the adjusted income of an eligible individual for a base taxation year, in relation to a month
 - (a) is less than or equal to \$17,397, the benefit reduction "E" shall equal zero; and

- (b) is greater than \$17,397, the benefit reduction "E" shall be calculated by multiplying the difference between the adjusted income and \$17,397 by
 - (i) 5.07% where there is one qualified dependent,
 - (ii) 10.45% where there are 2 qualified dependents,
 - (iii) 16.22% where there are 3 qualified dependents, and
 - (iv) the total of 16.22%, and the product obtained by multiplying the number of qualified dependents in excess of 3 by 6.19%.

Commencement

2. This regulation comes into force on July 1, 2011.

NLR 105/03 as amended 1. Paragraph 2(g.1) of the Student Financial Assistance Regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

(g.1) "prime rate" means, for any day, the variable reference rate of interest as calculated by Canada's Minister of Human

Resources and Skills Development based upon the variable reference rates of interest declared on the previous business day by the largest 5 Canadian institutions as their prime rate, calculated by ignoring both the highest and lowest of those 5 rates and taking the average of the remaining 3 rates;

2. Paragraphs 3(8)(e), (f) and (g) of the regulations are repealed and the following substituted:

- (e) have a grade 12 or equivalent entrance requirement or a mature student policy in place that is acceptable to the minister:
- (f) have a default prevention plan that is acceptable to the minister:
- (g) adhere to all specified administrative requirements of the minister; and

3. Paragraph 5.5(a) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

- (a) any refund of fees paid to an educational institution by the borrower of
 - (i) financial assistance, or
 - (ii) funds intended as financial assistance

as provided under the Act shall be paid by the educational institution to the borrower's lender for credit against a student loan received under the Act by the borrower;

4. (1) Subsection 5.9(8) of the regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

(8) Upon consolidation of a student loan, interest on that loan shall accrue daily and shall be calculated and payable monthly.

(2) Section 5.9 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (9) the following:

(10) Notwithstanding another provision of this section, interest calculated under this section shall be calculated as simple interest and shall not be compounded.

5. Section 7 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (3) the following:

- (4) Notwithstanding another provision of this section, the grant issued to a borrower
 - (a) before August 1, 2005 shall not exceed \$110 per week of study;
 - (b) between August 1, 2005 and July 31, 2007 shall not exceed \$140 per week of study;
 - (c) between August 1, 2007 and July 31, 2009 shall not exceed \$70 per week of study; and
 - (d) on or after August 1, 2009 shall not exceed \$60 per week of study.
- (5) Notwithstanding another provision of this section, a borrower who graduated between August 1, 2002 and August 1, 2004 shall receive the greater of the benefit to which they were entitled under this section or section 8 during that period.

6. (1) Section 10 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (1) the following:

- (1.1) The start date of the payment deferral period may predate the date of the application by 6 months.
- (2) Section 10 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after section (2) the following:
- (2.1) In assessing an application for deferral, the minister may consider whether the borrower has declared bankruptcy under the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act* (Canada), and notwithstanding that the bankruptcy has not been discharged, the minister may consider and

approve an application for deferral under this section where other eligibility criteria have been met.

- (3) Section 10 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (4) the following:
- (4.1) The time period referred to in subsection (4) shall be calculated from the date the borrower ceases to be a full time student.
- (4) Section 10 of the regulations is amended by adding immediately after subsection (5) the following:
- (5.1) Once in a borrower's lifetime, 3 months of interest may be capitalized to the borrower's loan principal.

Commencement

- 7. (1) Sections 1, 3 and 4 of these regulations are considered to have come into force on April 1, 2004.
- (2) Section 2 of these regulations is considered to have come into force on August 1, 2002.
- (3) Section 5 of these regulations is considered to have come into force on August 1, 2002.
- (4) Section 6 of these regulations is considered to have come into force on May 11, 2004.
