ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION ACT AND THE ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT REGULATIONS, 2003

NOTICE

IN ACCORDANCE with the *Environmental Protection Act* and subsection 19(2) of the *Environmental Assessment Regulations, 2003*, the Minister of Environment and Conservation gives the following Notice:

On June 20, 2013, the Minister of Environment and Conservation informed Nalcor Energy that under the authority of Section 67(3) (a) of the *Environmental Protection Act, SNL 2002, cE-14.2*, the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has released the Labrador-Island Transmission Link from further environmental assessment, subject to the following terms and conditions:

- The proponent, Nalcor Energy, shall adhere to all mitigation, monitoring and commitments stated in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) submitted April 12, 2012 and the additional EIS information submitted December 10, 2012;
- The proponent shall submit a Diversity Plan for the Project satisfactory to the Minister Responsible for the Status of Women and the Minister of Environment and Conservation;
- The proponent shall prepare an EPP for the following Project Valued Ecosystem Components (VECs), in order to minimize disturbance and mitigate potential effects on VECs during Project construction and operation and submit the EPP to the Minister of Environment and Conservation for approval prior to the start of any site-specific construction. The EPP will address the following VECs:
 - i. Vegetation;
 - ii. Island Caribou;
 - iii. Furbearers and Small Mammals (including American marten in Labrador);
 - iv. Avifauna (species not covered by Section 19 of the Endangered Species Act); and
 - v. Freshwater Fish;
- The proponent shall prepare an EPP for all applicable construction and operation activities and submit the EPP to the Minister of Environment and Conservation for approval prior to the start of any site specific construction;
- The proponent shall prepare Environmental Effects Monitoring Plans (EEMs), in consultation with the applicable Government divisions, and submit them to the Minister of Environment and Conservation for approval prior to the start of

any site specific construction. The EEMs will address the following VECs and will be developed to monitor effects as a result of the Project and to ensure that any changes to existing baseline as a result of Project effects are documented and mitigated:

- vi. Vegetation;
 - vii. Island Caribou;
 - viii. Furbearers and Small Mammals (including American marten in Labrador);
 - ix. Avifauna (species not covered by Section 19 of the Endangered Species Act); and
 - x. Freshwater Fish;
- The proponent shall provide financing for two full-time positions of Environmental Monitor, employed by the Department of Environment and Conservation, whose responsibilities will include monitoring the biophysical components related to the L-ITL Project. One position will be for the duration of the construction of the L-ITL Project (approximately four years) and the second will be for the duration of drilling and cable installation activities at the Shoal Cove, Newfoundland, cable landing site in the Strait of Belle Isle (approximately one year);
 - The proponent, in consultation with the Newfoundland and Labrador Outfitters Association and outfitters who may potentially be impacted by the L-ITL project, will develop a monitoring plan related to the potential impacts of the Project on these outfitters. Should direct impacts be identified, the proponent shall work with the affected outfitters and the Newfoundland and Labrador Outfitters Association to develop reasonable compensation provisions. In areas with new project access, the proponent will also design and implement an Access Decommissioning Plan to mitigate diminished outfitting success rates; and
 - The proponent is required to prepare and submit to the Minister of Environment and Conservation for approval a Species at Risk Project Impacts Mitigation and Monitoring Plan to provide protection for listed species, to the greatest extent possible, through avoidance measures and mitigation of the impacts resulting from authorized activities, as well as to monitor the effects of authorized activities on listed species at risk. Approval of this plan will be a precondition to the issuance to the proponent of an Economic Activity Permit under Section 19 of the *Endangered Species Act*.

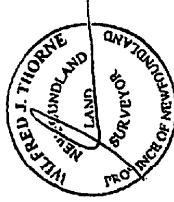
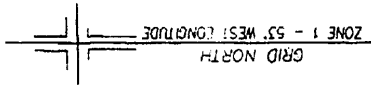

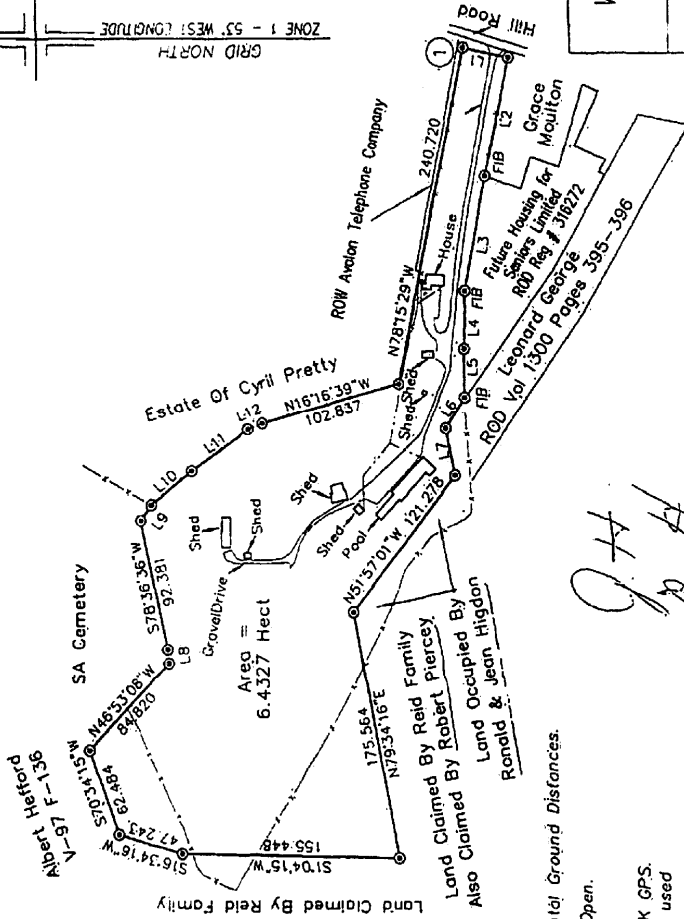

- Short title **1.** These regulations may be cited as the *Foresters Regulations*.
- Definition **2.** In these regulations "Act" means the *Foresters Act*.
- Professional forester **3.** A person is entitled to be registered as a professional forester where, in addition to the other applicable requirements of the Act, the regulations and the by-laws, he or she
- (a) completes an application in the prescribed form; and
- (b) either has
- (i) a baccalaureate degree in the science of forestry from a school, college or university program recognized by the Canadian Forestry Accreditation Board and has accumulated a minimum of 2 years experience as a forester-in-training in the province,
- (ii) a baccalaureate degree in a science, other than the science of forestry, and has
- (A) a minimum of 4 years experience in forestry in the capacity of a forester of which 2 years has been as a forester-in-training in the province,
- (B) had his or her core competencies evaluated by the Central Assessment Authority of the Canadian Federation of Professional Foresters Association, and
- (C) has successfully passed the examinations prescribed by the association to demonstrate competence in

core subject areas considered deficient by the Central Assessment Authority evaluation, or

- (iii) a certificate of good standing from the jurisdiction where he or she is currently registered as the equivalent of a professional forester.

Forester-in-training

4. A person is entitled to be registered as a forester-in-training where, in addition to the other applicable requirements of the Act, the regulations and the by-laws, he or she

(a) completes an application in the prescribed form; and

(b) either has

(i) a baccalaureate degree in the science of forestry from a school, college or university program recognized by the Canadian Forestry Accreditation Board, or

(ii) a baccalaureate degree in a science other than the science of forestry and has a minimum of 2 years experience in forestry in the capacity of a forester.

Exceptions

5. (1) For the purposes of subsection 17(4) of the Act, a person who submitted his or her application prior to May 31, 2013 may be admitted to membership where he or she meets the requirements in paragraphs 17(1)(a), (b) and (d) of the Act and has

(a) a baccalaureate degree in science; and

(b) a minimum of 4 recent years experience in forestry in the capacity of a forester.

(2) Notwithstanding subparagraph 3(b)(i) and clause 3(b)(ii)(A), a person who does not have 2 years experience as a forester-in-training may be eligible for registration as a professional forester where he or she

(a) submits his or her application for registration on or before May 31, 2014; and

(b) has 2 years experience in forestry in the capacity of a forester.

- Restricted members **6.** A restricted member shall have the rights and obligations prescribed in the by-laws but shall not have the right to
- (a) vote; or
 - (b) use the title "professional forester" or "forester-in-training".
- Filing of an allegation **7.** (1) Within 30 days of receipt of an allegation the respondent shall be notified in writing that an allegation has been received.
- (2) A respondent shall have 30 days from the notification of the allegation to respond to the complainant's allegation.
- (3) Notwithstanding subsection (2), the professional conduct committee, or a person appointed by the professional conduct committee, may request and accept from a respondent a further reply to an allegation.
- Discipline committee hearing date **8.** (1) A discipline committee shall set a hearing date within 120 days of the decision of the professional conduct committee that grounds exist to start a disciplinary proceeding.
- (2) The chairperson of the discipline committee may extend the time period referred to in subsection (1) after first seeking the opinions of the respondent and the council regarding the extension.
- Decision of discipline committee **9.** The written decision and orders of the discipline committee shall be provided to the council and the respondent within 90 days of the completion of the hearing of the complaint by the discipline committee.

1. The *Newfoundland and Labrador T' Railway Provincial Park Proclamation* is amended by repealing the description of Little Harbour property - Parcel 1 and substituting the following:

4. Little Harbour property - parcel 1

All that piece or parcel of land situate and being located at Little Harbour, in the Electoral District of Humber Valley, in the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, being further bounded and described as follows

Beginning at a point, that point being the northerly angle of the described lot and having co-ordinates of north 5,442,235.256 and east 376,690.675;

Then running from the described point of beginning by the Newfoundland and Labrador T'Railway Provincial Park, 30.48 metres wide, south 0° 58' 07" east 35.351 metres;

Then running by land granted by the Crown to Bishop O'Reilly General Assembly of the Knights of Columbus, and registered under Vol. 166-Fol. 32 in the Registry of Crown Grants, south 58° 35' 53" west 1,018.353 metres to a point, and along a curve of radius 719.440 metres, in a counterclockwise direction, to a point being distant 34.068 metres, as measured on a bearing of south 57° 14' 23" west from the last mentioned point;

Then running by the Newfoundland and Labrador T'Railway Provincial Park, 30.48 metres wide, along a curve of radius 105.000 metres, in a counterclockwise direction, to a point being distant 79.234 metres, as measured on a bearing of south 75° 37' 26" west from the last mentioned point;

Then running by land of the Columbus Club of Corner Brook, L.S. 1031, along a curve of radius 749.920 metres, in a clockwise direction, to a point being distant 110.116 metres, as measured on a bearing of north 54° 23' 10" east from the last mentioned point;

Then continuing by said land of the Columbus Club of Corner Brook, north 58° 35' 53" east 1,036.260 metres, more or less, to the point of beginning containing an area of 3.314 hectare more or less;

All bearings refer to 3° Grid North NAD 1983 as referred to the Transverse Mercator Projection for Newfoundland and Labrador with the Central Meridian at 58° 30' west longitude.
