1. The Newfoundland and Labrador T'Railway Provincial Park Proclamation is amended by adding at the end of the Schedule the following:

The area described in this Schedule is decreased by removing the following parcel of land:

All that piece or parcel of land lying northwest of Musgrave Drive, in the Town of Steady Brook, in the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, in the Electoral District of Humber East and being bounded and abutted as follows, that is to say:

1. Section 21 of the Workplace Health, Safety and Compensation Regulations is repealed and the following substituted:

Maximum compensable and assessable earnings

21. (1) For the purpose of section 102 and subsection 80(8) of the Act, the maximum compensable assessable earnings for 2014 shall be calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$MCAE = GW \times CPI$$

where

MCAE means the maximum compensable assessable earnings

GW means gross wages of \$60,155

CPI means the difference, rounded to one decimal place, between

- (i) the average monthly Consumer Price Index for Canada as published by Statistics Canada for July 2012 to June 2013, and
- (ii) the average monthly Consumer Price Index for Canada as published by Statistics Canada for July 2011 to June 2012
- (2) For the purpose of section 102 and subsection 80(8) of the Act, the maximum compensable assessable earnings for 2015 and each year after that shall be calculated annually in accordance with the following formula:

$$MCAE = PMCAE \times CPI$$

where

MCAE means the maximum compensable assessable earnings

PMCAE means the maximum compensable assessable earnings for the previous year

CPI means the difference, rounded to one decimal place, between

- (i) the average monthly Consumer Price Index as published for Canada by Statistics Canada for the 12 month July to June period immediately preceding the year of the maximum compensable assessable earnings calculation, and
- (ii) the average monthly Consumer Price Index as published for Canada by Statistics Canada for the 12 month July to June period immediately preceding the period referred to in subparagraph (i).

Commencement

2. These regulations come into force on January 1, 2014.
