



**4.** (1) Salmon retained by angling on rivers with a yearly quota of 6 salmon (Class 6) under section 13.1 and Schedule I of the *Newfoundland and Labrador Fishery Regulations* (Canada) shall be tagged with red, green or blue tags.

### 3. Section 7 of the Order is repealed and the following substituted:

Tags - nonscheduled rivers **7.** Salmon retained by angling on a river or other inland waters with a yearly quota of 2 salmon (Class 2) under section 13.1 of the *Newfoundland and Labrador Fishery Regulations* (Canada) that is not listed in Schedule I of those regulations shall be tagged with red tags only.
