TAKE NOTICE that the NAIN INUIT COMMUNITY GOVERNMENT (NICG) Development Regulations Amendment No. 1, 2014, adopted on 22nd October, 2014,

has been registered by the Minister of Municipal and Intergovernmental Affairs on 22nd December, 2014.

In general terms, the purpose of the said amendment is to enable NICG to approve yards required for development on lots with unusually configured shapes or small dimensions, for lots which existed prior to the coming into effect of the Development Regulations, in cases where such yards would not otherwise comply with requirements. Every such yard shall be a minimum of 0.5 metres, the specific distance to be subject to the discretion of NICG.

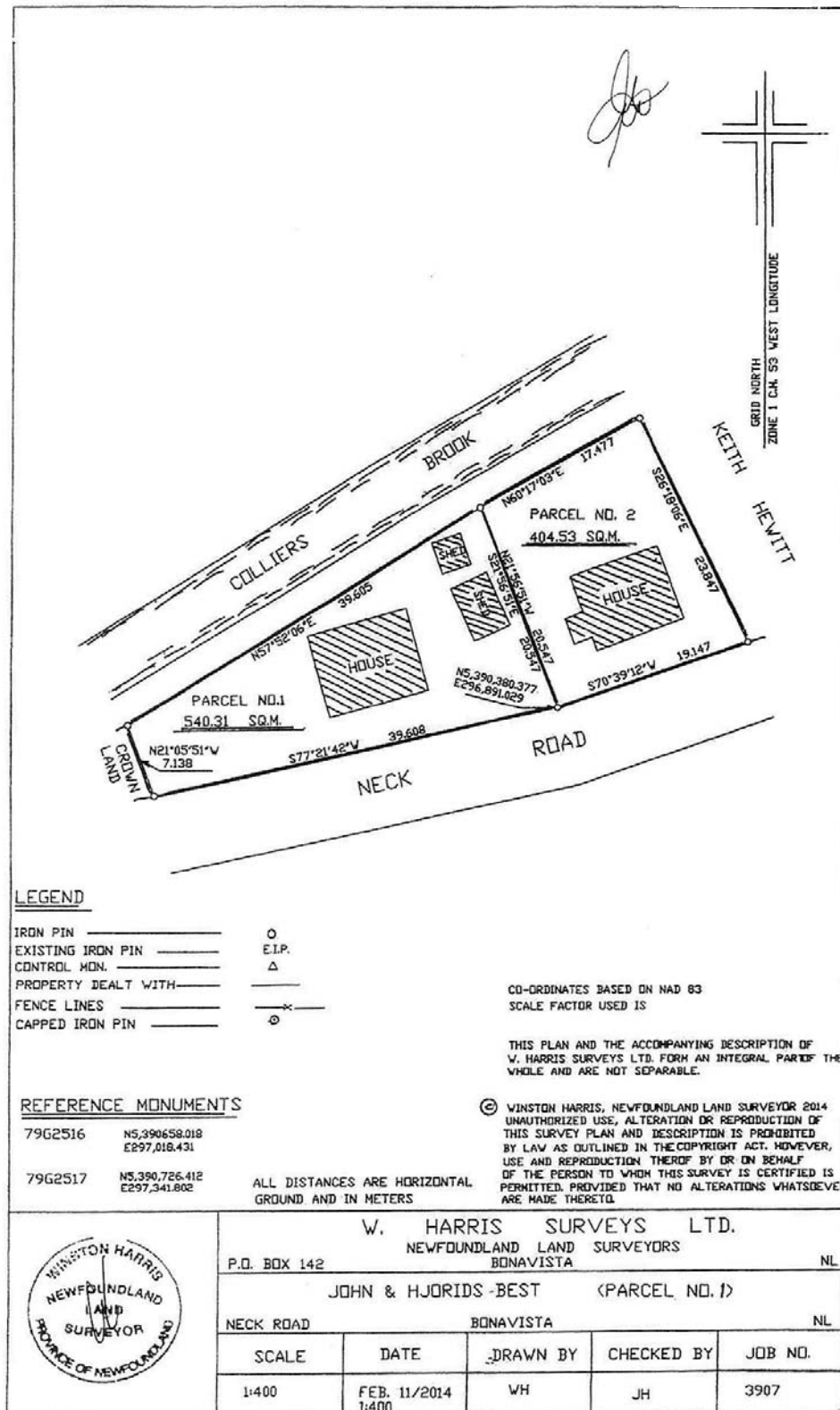

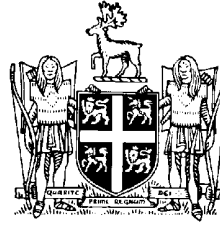
