CANADA-NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR OFFSHORE PETROLEUM BOARD CALL FOR BIDS No. NL15-01EN (Eastern Nefoundland)

The Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Petroleum Board hereby gives notice of a call for the submission of bids in respect of eleven parcels in the Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Offshore Area.

This notice of the Call for Bids No. NL15-01EN is made pursuant and subject to the *Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Atlantic Accord Implementation Act*, S.C., 1987, c. 3, and the *Canada-Newfoundland and Labrador Atlantic Accord Implementation Newfoundland and Labrador Act*, RSNL1990 cC-2.

The following is a summary of the Call for Bids No. NL15-01EN:

- (i) Sealed bids will be received by the Board prior to the time of closing of this Call for Bids No. NL15-01EN. This call for bids will close at 12:00 p.m., Newfoundland Standard Time, on November 12, 2015, except as specifically provided for in the Call for Bids No. NL15-01EN.
- (ii) All bids must be submitted in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Call for Bids No. NL15-01EN.
- (iii) The parcels are located offshore Newfoundland and Labrador and are described in Schedule I. An Exploration Licence may be issued for each parcel.
- (iv) For the purpose of selecting a bid, the sole criterion to be used will be the total amount of money the bidder commits to expend on exploration on the parcels within Period I ("Work Expenditure Bid").
- (v) The minimum Work Expenditure Bid will be \$10 million for each parcel offered in this Call for Bids.
- (vi) Allowable expenditures may be claimed for those permitted expenses incurred from the date of the initial announcement of the call for bids up to and including the effective date of the licence. These new credits would be in addition to those allowable expenditures available for credit during the term of the licence.

- (vii) Period I of the exploration licence shall have a term of six (6) years unless otherwise extended by a drilling deposit. Period II shall immediately follow Period I and consist of the balance of the original nine (9) year term.
- (viii) The Interest Owner may, at its option, extend Period I for additional years to a maximum total of three (3) extensions by posting a drilling deposit with the Board before the end of Period I or any additional year extension of Period I in the following amounts:

Period I A - 1 year extension - \$5 million Period I B - 1 year extension - \$10 million Period I C - 1 year extension - \$15 million

If a drilling deposit is posted, it will be refunded in full if the well commitment is met during the respective period of extension. Otherwise, the drilling deposit will be forfeited upon termination of that period extension.

(ix) The Work Expenditure Bid must be accompanied by a bank draft or certified cheque in the amount of \$10,000 ("Bid Deposit") made payable to the Receiver General. Furthermore, the successful bidder will be required to provide, within 15 days of notification of being the successful bidder, a promissory note in the amount of 25% of the Work Expenditure Bid ("Security Deposit"). A credit against the Security Deposit will be made on the basis of 25% of allowable expenditures as described in the Exploration Licence ("Allowable Expenditures").

A successful bidder will receive a refund, without interest, of the Bid Deposit when the Security Deposit is posted within 15 days. Failure to post the Security Deposit within 15 days will result in forfeiture of the Bid Deposit and disqualification of the bid.

Following the announcement of the bid results, the Bid Deposits of unsuccessful bidders will be returned, without interest, as soon as possible.

The licence requirement will be one well to be commenced within Period I and diligently pursued thereafter.

(x) Rentals will be applicable only in Period II at the following rates:

1 st year	\$5.00 per hectare
2 nd year	\$7.50 per hectare
3 rd year	\$10.00 per hectare

When an Exploration Licence continues in force beyond Period II, rentals will be payable at the rates applicable during the last year of Period II.

Rentals will be refunded annually, to a maximum of 100% of the rentals paid in that year, on the basis of a dollar refund for each dollar of Allowable Expenditures for that year.

Carry forward provisions to reduce rentals otherwise payable in ensuing rental years will apply.

- (xi) An Allowable Expenditure schedule will have application throughout Period I of the Exploration Licence. The rates of Allowable Expenditures will be reviewed, and may be amended, at the expiration of Period I.
- (xii) Each resulting Significant Discovery Licence shall be subject to a rental regime as described in Schedule IV of the Sample Exploration Licence for Call for Bids NL15-01EN.
- (xiii) A successful bidder will be required to comply with the procurement, employment and reporting procedures as established by the Board in its *Exploration Benefits Plan Guidelines*.

These parcels will be subject to the payment of issuance fees and Environmental Studies Research Fund levies.

- (xiv) The Board is not obliged to accept any bid or issue any interest as a result of this call for bids.
- (xv) Any licence that may be issued shall be in the form of the exploration licence attached to the Call for Bids No. NL15-01EN.

The area known as Lawn Bay Ecological Reserve is established as an ecological reserve primarily to protect the internationally significant seabird breeding colony of the Manx Shearwater (*Puffinus puffinus*) and its habitat. In addition to Manx Shearwater, the Reserve also protects breeding habitat for eight other seabird species. Scientific research at the site will be encouraged and educational use and commercial and non-commercial use may be permitted where it does not conflict with the general objective of site protection and scientific research. To limit disturbances to seabirds during the breeding season and minimize habitat erosion year-round, access to Middle Lawn Island is by special permit only. Restrictions on access to the Swale and Colombier Islands and the surrounding marine zone shall be in place throughout the breeding season.

The managing agency for the reserve is Parks and Natural Areas Division of the Department of Environment and Conservation.

Definitions	2. In these regulations
	(a) "Act" means the Wilderness and Ecological Reserves Act;

	(g) "management plan" means the management plan for a de- clared reserve on file with the managing agency;

	(k) "permit" means a permit issued under these regulations;

	(m) "reserve" means a seabird ecological reserve set aside under the Act and listed in the Schedule;
	(n) "structure" means a man-made object intended to be perma- nent or semi-permanent in nature and includes buildings, houses, cottages, cabins, wharves, docks, boathouses, slip- ways, trailers, mobile homes, tent platforms, shelters and recreational vehicles used for any purpose, but does not in- clude temporary equipment associated with scientific re- search or monitoring or objects erected by the managing agency; and
	(o) "wildlife" means an animal or plant.
Restrictions	3. Within a reserve, a person shall not
	(a) pollute or obstruct a stream or other body of water;
	(b) dispose of garbage;
	(c) introduce a plant or animal species, or any other organism;
	(d) build or erect or cause to have built or erected a structure;
	(e) hunt, remove or disturb wildlife;
	(f) destroy, damage, remove, disturb or handle the home, den or nest of wildlife;
	(g) be in possession of a firearm unless the firearm is securely wrapped and tied;
	(h) destroy, damage, remove, displace or handle the egg of any wild bird;
	 (i) destroy, damage, remove or displace any wildlife, fossil or other natural object;

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- (j) remove or displace soil, sand, stone or gravel;
- (k) prospect, claim stake, mine or quarry;
- (1) post, destroy, damage, remove or displace a sign or other government property;
- (m) use, operate or be in possession of a motorized vehicle;
- (n) light or maintain a fire, open or contained in boats, except contained fires which are permitted in ships travelling through the marine portion of a reserve;
- (o) erect or maintain a camp, or otherwise carry on any camping activity;
- (p) apply any chemical to a reserve;
- (q) operate or be in possession of a personal watercraft within a reserve;
- (r) use a bicycle;
- (s) operate a commercial establishment or commercial enterprise within a reserve, except guiding, touring, outfitting, photography, videography or sound recording, in accordance with a permit issued under these regulations;
- (t) operate a non-commercial establishment or non-commercial enterprise within a reserve, except guiding, touring, outfitting, photography, videography or sound recording, in accordance with a permit issued under these regulations; and
- (u) display, post or broadcast an advertisement.

4. A person engaged in the administration or management of a reserve in the normal course of his or her duties is exempt from

- (a) paragraphs 3(e), (f), (g), (h), (i), (j), (l), (m), (n), (o), (r) and (u), subsections 12(1), (2) and (3), and section 13; and
- (b) paragraph 3(c) where he or she has written authorization from the managing agency.

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Exception for management

5. (1) The minister, or a person authorized by the minister, may Permits issue a permit or other written authorization that allows certain activities to be carried on in a reserve, subject to the restrictions imposed by these regulations and the Act. The activities referred to in subsection (1) may be limited (2)by the conditions declared on the permit or in the written authorization. (3) A permit or written authorization shall be issued in accordance with the guidelines described in the management plan for a reserve. (4) Permits may be issued for a period to be determined by the managing agency and may be renewed, upon expiration, on the terms and conditions that the managing agency may determine. 6. Scientific research within a reserve shall require a permit and Research those permits may be obtained from the managing agency on submission of a written request outlining the research project, and subject to the terms and conditions that the managing agency may determine. 7. A person engaged in a scientific study approved by the manag-Exception for research ing agency and for which a permit has been issued may be exempted from paragraphs 3(c), (e), (f), (g), (h), (i), (j) and (o), subsections 12(1), (2) and (3), and section 13. 8. (1) Educational activities within a reserve shall require a permit Educational activities and those permits may be obtained from the managing agency on submission of a written request outlining the activity, and subject to the terms and conditions that the managing agency may determine. (2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), a permit is not required where the persons engaged in the educational activities are accompanied by a managing agency staff person as part of a regularly scheduled tour. 9. (1) A person engaged in a commercial or non-commercial en-Commercial and non-commercial terprise for touring, guiding, outfitting, photography, videography or enterprises

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sound recording within a reserve shall obtain a permit for the enterprise from the managing agency and the permit shall be subject to the terms

and conditions that the managing agency may determine.

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(2) Application for a permit shall provide a full description of the enterprise planned.

(3) Within the Witless Bay Islands Ecological Reserve, a tour boat having a permit issued under subsection (1) is exempt from subsection 12(2), notwithstanding anything in the management plan to the contrary.

10. Visitor access to a reserve, other than for reasons described in sections 6, 8, 9 and 11, is allowed but may be restricted or require a permit from the managing agency in accordance with guidelines described in the management plan for the reserve or at the discretion of the managing agency.

11. (1) Commercial fishing and recreational fishing in accordance with other applicable legislation is permitted within the marine waters of a reserve.

(2) Angling in accordance with other applicable legislation is permitted.

(3) A person engaged in commercial fishing is exempt from paragraphs 3(e) and (i) and subsections 12(1), (2) and (3) to the extent that it is necessary for the proper conduct of this activity.

(4) A person engaged in recreational fishing is exempt from paragraphs 3(e) and (i) and subsections 12(1), (2) and (3) to the extent that is necessary for the proper conduct of this activity.

Operation of boat

Visitor access

Fishing

12. (1) Within the marine portion of the Baccalieu Island and Cape St. Mary's Ecological Reserves, a person shall not operate

- (a) a motorized boat within 100 metres of cliffs containing nesting birds from April 1 to October 30; and
- (b) a non-motorized boat within 20 metres of cliffs containing nesting seabirds from April 1 to October 30.

(2) Within the Witless Bay Islands Ecological Reserve, a person shall not operate

(a) a motorized boat within 20 metres of Gull Island, Great Island and Pee Pee Island from April 1 to September 1;

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- (b) a non-motorized boat, within 15 metres of Gull Island, Great Island and Pee Pee Island from April 1 to September 1;
- (c) a motorized boat within 100 metres of Green Island from April 1 to September 1; and
- (d) a non-motorized boat within 50 metres of Green Island from April 1 to September 1.

(3) Within the Lawn Bay Ecological Reserve, a person shall not operate a motorized or non-motorized boat within 100 metres of Middle Lawn Island, Swale Island and Colombier Island from March 15 to October 30.

- (4) A person shall not operate within a reserve
- (a) a dragger, tanker, freighter, barge, or a vessel longer than 20 metres; and
- (b) a boat in a manner that disturbs wildlife or allows noise from the boat or persons on board to disturb wildlife.

(5) A person in possession of a valid access permit is exempt from subsections (1), (2) and (3) for the purpose of using a boat to land in a reserve.

Operation of aircraft

- **13.** (1) A person shall not operate an aircraft over
 - (a) the Cape St. Mary's and Baccalieu Island Ecological Reserves at an altitude less than 300 metres from April 1 to October 30;
 - (b) the Witless Bay Islands Ecological Reserve at an altitude less than 300 metres from April 1 to September 1; and
 - (c) the Lawn Bay Ecological Reserve at an altitude less than 300 metres from March 15 to October 30.
 - (2) An aircraft shall not take off or land in
 - (a) the Cape St. Mary's and Baccalieu Island Ecological Reserves from April 1 to October 30;

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- (b) the Witless Bay Islands Ecological Reserve from April 1 to September 1; and
- (c) the Lawn Bay Ecological Reserve from March 15 to October 30.

Domestic animals **14.** (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3), a person shall not allow a domestic animal to enter a reserve.

- (2) A person may enter a reserve with a dog if
- (a) the dog is a seeing eye dog specially trained for that purpose and is being used for that purpose; and
- (b) the seeing eye dog is kept under control at all times.

(3) A person may keep sheep within the Cape St. Mary's Ecological Reserve in accordance with the management plan for the reserve.

Property in reserve

15. Persons with legal title to structures within a reserve may continue to upkeep and repair these structures in accordance with guide-lines described in the management plan for the reserve or at the discretion of the managing agency.

Baccalieu Island Ecological Reserve **16.** (1) Within the Baccalieu Island Ecological Reserve, an employee of the federal Department of Transport, or a person working on the behalf of that department,

- (a) is exempt from paragraph 3(d) for the purpose of maintaining existing paths or structures associated with the operation and maintenance of the facilities existing prior to provisional reserve establishment; and
- (b) is exempt from subsection 12(1) and section 13 for the purpose of transporting persons or goods to and from the existing facilities, in accordance with the procedures outlined under the management plan of the reserve.
- (2) Within the Baccalieu Island Ecological Reserve,

- (a) a person in the process of landing a boat in Ned Walsh's Cove or London Cove, is exempted from subsection 12(1); and
- (b) a person is permitted to have a small open or contained fire on the designated landing sites of Ned Walsh's Cove and London Cove.

(3) Within the Baccalieu Island Ecological Reserve, berry picking is permitted except in areas of high concentration of seabirds breeding, where access permits are necessary.

17. These regulations shall apply to the reserves listed in the Schedule, except to the extent that they have been modified by the Order declaring a given reserve in effect.

18. The Seabird Ecological Reserve Regulations, Newfoundland and Labrador Regulation 66/97, is repealed.
