 - (iv) methamphetamine,
 - (v) phencyclidine, also known as PCP,
 - (vi) psilocin,
 - (vii) psilocybin, or
 - (viii) 6-monoacetylmorphine.

(5) A motor vehicle impounded under subsection (4) shall be held for a period of 7 days after which period the vehicle may be released in accordance with subsection 19(1).
