Regulatory Advice from Government Departments

EA 2270 – Flat Bay Brook Outfitters Lodge (the Project)

During the environmental assessment of the Project, provincial and federal government departments and agencies indicated that the following plans, permits, licences, approvals and/or other authorizations are or may be required before your Project commences. This is not intended to be a comprehensive list and you are responsible for consulting with federal and provincial government authorities regarding any additional authorizations that may be required by law.

The Climate Change Branch (CCB) of the Department of Environment and Climate Change (ECC) advises you to consider provincial climate change projections for Stephenville in the planning for this undertaking as it is anticipated that extreme precipitation events will become more intense. All heavy- duty equipment used in the construction phase of the Project should be operated in a manner to maximize fuel efficiency, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions that could contribute to climate change. The Pollution Prevention Division (PPD) of ECC advises that if pesticide use is planned, a Pesticide Applicator License will be required, or if pest control services are contracted, the business must have a valid Pesticide Operator's Licence. Spill response equipment should be readily available, and a Spill Contingency Plan specific to the proposed undertaking should be developed. Any spill or leak of gasoline or associated product is to be reported immediately by calling the Environmental Emergencies Telephone Line at 1- 800-563-9089. The Water Resources Management Division (WRMD) of ECC advises that under the authority of the **Water Resources Act** you are required to obtain a Section 58 permit for construction of a non-domestic well and a Water Use License for the use of any water for any purpose. Any effluent or runoff leaving the site must conform to the requirements of the Environmental Control Water and Sewage Regulations, 2003. The Government Service Centre of the (GSC) of the Department of Digital Government and Service NL (DGSNL) advises that the Project is required to comply with the **Environmental Protection Act** and associated regulations. All fuel storage tank system installations other than those connected to a heating appliance of a capacity of 2,500 litres or less are subject to the Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulations and will require registration prior to installation. All fuel storage tank systems connected to a heating appliance of a capacity of 2,500 litres or less are subject to the Storage and Handling of Gasoline and Associated Products Regulations and will require registration prior to installation. All fuel storage tank systems connected to a heating appliance of a capacity of 2,500 litres or less must comply with the Heating Oil Storage Tank System Regulations.

Proposed fuel caches require approval by DGSNL prior to installation. The storage, handling, and disposal of used and or waste oil must be in compliance with the Used Oil and Used Glycol Control Regulations. Registration with DGSNL for all commercial buildings is required as per Compliance with Fire and Life Safety and Building Accessibility obligations. The Occupational Health and Safety Division (OHS) of DGSNL advises you to ensure that the activities associated with the development are conducted in compliance with the **Occupational Health and Safety Act** and its Regulations.
