The Climate Change Branch (CCB) of the Department of Environment and Climate Change advises that any heavy-duty equipment used in the construction phase of the Project should be operated in a manner to maximize fuel efficiency, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions that could contribute to climate change. The Pollution Prevention Division (PPD) of the Department of Environment and Climate Change advises that all waste material shall be considered for reuse, resale or recycling prior to disposal. - A management plan that includes appropriate preventative measures to minimize the risk of impacts on migratory birds;
- A gull management plan focused on the exclusion of gulls from different food sources such as feed, carcasses and other wastes should be in place prior to operations;
- An oil spill prevention and response plan.
- A contingency plan that considers potential accidents and malfunctions that take into account site-specific conditions and sensitivities.

ECCC further advises that in order to avoid nest destruction and to accommodate the breeding season of migratory birds, operations should consider nesting locations between April 15 and August 15 in this region.
