MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between Corner Brook Pulp & Paper and NLOA and its Members

WHEREAS Corner Brook Pulp and Paper and the NLOA mutually acknowledge the importance of both wood harvesting and outfitting to the economy of Newfoundland and Labrador and the significant employment both industries create.

AND WHEREAS both CBPP and NLOA agree that reasonable and mutually acceptable measures can usually be found to reduce any conflicts between wood harvesting and existing outfitting operations.

THE PARTIES THEREFORE AGREE TO THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. That using maps provided by the Department of Tourism, Recreation and Culture and/or coordinates provided by individual outfitters, CBPP will become familiar with the location of outfitting operations within its limits.
- 2. That individual outfitters that become aware of CBPP's wood cutting plans that might affect them, will undertake to contact CBPP.
- 3. That when any outfitting operation falls within CBPP's proposed cutting plans, each party will contact the other so that discussions can occur to identify any potential conflict.
- 4. That CBPP and the affected outfitter will work to implement measures that will, where possible:
 - a. Minimize the impact of wood harvesting operations on the individual outfitter; and
 - b. Minimize the impact of any changes on CBPP'S wood cost.
- 5. That if CBPP and the affected outfitter cannot reach a mutual agreement then discussions will be expanded to include a representative from the NLOA.
- 6. That after significant discussion, if agreement still cannot be reached, then discussions will be expanded again to include:
 - a. The affected outfitter
 - b. CBPP representative
 - c. NLOA representative
 - d. Department of Forestry representative
 - e. Department of Tourism/Wildlife representative
