The Undertaking:

Nature of the undertaking:

The proponent wishes to construct an access road to their recreational cottage. A new single lane access road will connect an existing access road/open sand pit area off of Route 500 (Trans Labrador Highway) to cottage site #106368. (See map A for location).

The access road will follow the optimized route avoiding all waterways and marshes to minimize environmental impact.

Purpose/ rational / need for the undertaking:

The access road shall connect cottage site #106368 and Route 500 for easy access to remote cottage.

Description of the undertaking:

Geographic Location:

The access road will be situated just off Route 500 and Cabin lot #106368 in the province of Newfoundland Labrador. The municipalities of Wabush and Labrador City are located approximately 35KM West of proposed site.

Physical Features:

The terrain through which the proposed access road will pass is boreal forest with no major elevation changes throughout. The road will be approximately 4 meters (right of way to be cut 6 meters) in width and length of approximately 850 meters.

Culvert Work:

No culverts required.

Construction:

Construction activities will involve the following items of work.

Land clearing:

All timber to be cut will follow the permit conditions of a Domestic permit to cut crown timber.

Excavation, leveling, and filling:

Removal of stumps, moss and shrubbery and placement of fill to be completed with construction equipment - an excavator and/ or dozer. All machinery to be maintained and free of fluid leaks.

Potential sources of pollutants during the construction period will include: noise, dust and exhaust gases generated by equipment. Potential small spillages of fuel and lubricants from equipment, all efforts will be employed to minimize any effect on the environment.

Operation:

850 meter access road to recreational cottage for private vehicle.

Occupations:

No occupations to be employed.

Approval of the undertaking:

The following is the list of principle permits, licenses, and approvals required for the project.

Environmental Registration –Dept of Environment and Conservation/Environmental Assessment Division.

Permission to occupy Crown Land- Dept of Environment and Conservation/Crown Lands Division.

Domestic permit to cut crown Timber -Dept of Natural Resources.

Permit to access Highway -Dept of Transportation and Works.

Schedule:

Construction shall begin immediately, following approval. The provisional date of start for construction is August 8, 2009, with completion set for September 10, 2009.

All funding for this undertaking shall be provided by the proponent.


