Under and by virtue of the powers conferred by The Administration and Control of Lands of the Crown (Transfer) Act, 1966, the Act No. 62 of 1966, IT IS ORDERED that the administration and control of all the right, title and interest of Her Majesty in right of the Province of Newfoundland in and to ALL THAT piece or parcel of land and land covered by the waters of Bay d'Espoir in the Electoral District of Hermitage described in the Schedule hereto is hereby transferred to Her Majesty in right of Canada for use by the National Harbours Board of Canada for the development of a National Harbour SUBJECT to the condition that if and as soon as the said piece or parcel of land and land covered by the waters of Bay d'Espoir ceased to be used for the purposes of a National Harbour, Her Majesty in right of Canada will transfer the administration and control thereof to Her Majesty in right of the Province of Newfoundland.

SCHEDULE

ALL THAT piece or parcel of land and land covered by the waters of Bay d'Espoir in the Electoral District of Hermitage abutted and bounded as follows, that is to say: Beginning at a point at highwater mark on the westerly shore of Bay d'Espoir, south of Gills Hook, the said point having co-ordinates of north seven thousand one hundred and twenty feet and fifty-seven hundredths of a foot and east four thousand nine hundred and thirty-six feet and seventy-five hundredths of a foot from the co-ordinate system of the horizontal control of St. Albans Mapping; thence running by Crown land west four thousand

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seven hundred and sixteen feet and four-tenths of a foot and thence north thirty-seven degrees thirty-one minutes west one thousand three hundred and sixty-five feet and thence north seventy-eight degrees west three hundred and twenty feet; thence running along the southeasterly limit of the highway extending from Swanger Cove to St. Albans north thirty-nine degrees sixteen minutes east one hundred and ninety-two feet and six-tenths of a foot and thence north fifty-six degrees thirty minutes east five hundred and fifteen feet; thence crossing the said highway to a point in its northwesterly limit north thirty-three degrees thirty minutes west one hundred feet; thence turning and running north fifty-eight degrees two minutes west fifty-seven feet and six-tenths of a foot; thence running along the east side of the highway leading to St. Josephs north four degrees thirty-seven minutes west five hundred and thirty-six feet and eight-tenths of a foot; thence running along the north side of the said highway north eighty-eight degrees forty-four minutes west four hundred and eighty-seven feet and one-tenth of a foot and thence north seventy degrees forty-five minutes west two hundred and seventeen feet and three-tenths of a foot and thence north fifty-three degrees twenty minutes west four hundred and ninety-nine feet and six-tenths of a foot to a point in the river flowing into the bottom of Swanger Cove, the said point being north forty-six degrees thirty-six minutes east thirty-four feet and three-tenths of a foot from the centre of the highway bridge spanning the said river; thence running along the east side of the said highway north four degrees fifty-five minutes west one hundred and forty-eight feet and four-tenths of a foot and thence north one degree fourteen minutes west two

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hundred and seventy-five feet and nine tenths of a foot and thence north eleven degrees thirty-two minutes west two hundred and nine feet and nine-tenths of a foot and thence north one degree twenty minutes west two hundred and sixty-nine feet and three-tenths of a foot and thence north fifteen degrees thirty-nine minutes east one hundred and thirty-three feet and eight-tenths of a foot and thence north twenty-seven degrees twenty minutes east nine hundred and ten feet; thence running by Crown land north-sixty degrees east seven thousand five hundred and sixty-four feet and five-tenths of a foot to a point on the aforesaid highwater mark on the westerly shore of Bay d'Espoir; thence following the sinuosities of the shore of Bay d'Espoir at highwater mark in a general northeasterly, northerly and northwesterly directions to the mouth of the river flowing into the head of Bay d'Espoir; thence continuing and following the sinuosities of the easterly shore of Bay d'Espoir at highwater mark in a general southeasterly, southwesterly, southeasterly directions to the mouth of the brook flowing into the bottom of Morrisville; thence continuing along the sinuosities of the shore of Morrisville and the northern shore of the Southeast Arm of Bay d'Espoir to the mouth of Conne River; thence continuing and following the sinuosities of the southern shore line of the said Southeast Arm in a general southwesterly direction to the Village of Conne River; thence following the sinuosities of the shore of Bay d'Espoir in a general southwesterly direction to Island Point; thence crossing Bay d'Espoir in a northwesterly direction to a point on the western shore of Bay d'Espoir at highwater mark approximately one-half mile east of Frenchman's Head; thence continuing along the sinuosities

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of the western shore of Bay d'Espoir  
in a general northwesterly, south-  
easterly and northerly directions  
to the point of beginning, all  
bearings being referred to the  
true meridian.
