[2] Purpose/Rational need for the undertaking:

The purpose is to get access to the Burin Peninsula Super Trail and Cabins .Trail will be use for recreational activities such as ATVs, Snowmobiles and Hiking.

Description of the Undertaking;

[1] Geographical Location:

Please see attached map.ATV Trail starting point is Terrenceville and will travel towards Burin Peninsula Highway route 210.

[2] Physical Features:

The Trail as indicated on the map provided will be approximately 16 km in length and a maximum width of 4 meters.

Description of physical and biological environment:

The terrain along the trail consists mostly of rolling ridges, scrubs, and rock. There are three small brook crossings and appropriate culverts will be used.

[3] Construction:

Trail will be constructed to protect wetlands, streams and not to interfere with wildlife. There are three small brook crossings in route any brooks will be bridged with untreated Material or culverts will be used. Any Bog lands will be corduroyed if necessary. Construction by manual labour and some excavation will be required. Work on Trail will be done during summer and fall. This is the best time to identify wetlands and

also the best time to bridge any brooks.

[4] Potential sources of pollutants during the construction period:

Pollutants include air pollution from the diesel engine of the excavation and possible oil and fuel leaks.

[5] Potential causes of resource conflicts:

No conflicts with other users expected during construction.

[6]Operation:

Once the Trail is completed ATV, Snowmobiles and Hikers will travel the Trail likely on daily basis during all four seasons.

Summer time ATVs can travel on a safe Trail that is upgraded, marked, signed and kept up to standards.

Estimated Period of Operation:

The Trail will accessible all year round.

Potential Sources of Pollutants during Operation:

Possible fuel or oil leaks from ATVs and trash left behind by riders [trash cans will be in various locations]

The Trail will be used by proponents, ATVs, Snowmobilers, and Hikers.


