Aim of pirate-themed park is to spoil the outdoor enthusiast

ROBINSONS For as long as Paul Gale can remember, he has been intrigued by pirates and stories about them having been in the area.

There is one tale that is of particular interest to him and that's a buried treasure being under a large rock located on land he owns on Robinsons Head.

While there are different theories of who might have

buried treasure there, the most logical one to him would be Eric Cobham and Maria Lindsay, pirates who

would be Eric Coolant and warra Unicsay, pirates who are chronicled to have operated out of Sandy Point for some 90 years in the 1700s. Then there's Peter Easton, a pirate who was better known for being around Conception Bay South but one of his ships of a fleet of 10 was believed to have frequented waters in Western Newfoundland.

Because of the "lay of the land" of Robinsons Head,
Gale believes it would be an ideal place for a pirate to
bury treasure as it would be an easy landmark to spot
from the sea.

The history of Robinsons, named after an Irishmar

pirates was he was supposed to have taken in a boy, who had got his hand into a treasure chest on a pirate ship captured by a British man-of-war. After the boy was put off at Lark Harbour, Robinson took his daughter and the boy from there in a long boat, went to The Gravels at Port au Port and portaged it across there, eventually making their way south to a cave in the face of a cliff at what is today known as

Robinsons Head.
The story has it they later built a cabin on top of the head near a pond located there.
In the spirit of that and other local pirate history, Gale and his wife, Ruth Forsey-Gale have named their business Pirate's Haven, Chalets & Adventures
It's a theme park that is all-terrain-vehicle (ATV)

friendly that is geared towards Recreational Vehicle

campers.
"Our business is based on catering to ATV camper/
outdoor enthusiasts all year round. We will even have a number of secure permanent sites with lots of amenities for those who wish to leave their RV there year

In total, 60 acres of land is being developed for the park and it's overlooking Robinsons River, a licensed salmon stream and has access to five other rivers from

the Newfoundland T'Railway that actually goes through

the property.

The park is located in Moose Management Area 8,


The park is located in Moose Management Area 8, and has access to hundreds of miles of woods roads in that area, as well as Areas 9, 10 and 11. There is already a longhouse on site at the park, which is a log building measuring 24% 72° and will have an expansion of 16 % 72° this year to accommodate wasthrooms, showers, a laundry-mat, kitchenette and eather area.

As well, included in the theme park are such ameni-ties as a 24'x 24 cookhouse for a meeting area and 10 tent sites with picnic tables, running water and washroom facilities.

room facilities. There's access to beaches, a walking/hiking trail and the Appalachain Trail runs right through the property as well. They are offering ATV tours directly out of the park with certified guides and those excursions can include trouting & salmon fishing in back ponds, brooks & riv-

Early in the season this year. Gale expects to have 30 KY sites set up with running water, sewer and power hookups with 50-amp service. He's as well looking at 90 semi-serviced lots to be completed this summer as construction continues through the season.
