







**Map 1**

<b>NFS Inventory Map #: 323-34</b>		<b>NTS Map #: 23B14</b>	
<b>Description of Area:</b>	The 3LC commercial Cutting Block is located within the Mid-subarctic forest ecoregion. This is a moderately sized (49 ha) block of spruce and fir. It is not visible from the TLH, therefore should have little impact on the aesthetics of this area.		
<b>Harvesting Activity:</b>	The area has had previous sporadic harvesting and it will be harvested by commercial permit for sawlogs, energywood and fuelwood. There will be a combination of summer and winter harvesting and extraction. It is estimated that approximately 4,842 m <sup>3</sup> of softwood will be harvested out of this area between 2012 and 2016.		
<b>Silviculture Activity:</b>	Regeneration surveys will be conducted to determine level of natural regeneration 3-5 years after harvesting. A possible silviculture prescription of planting and/or gap planting of black spruce seedlings may be applied.		
<b>Primary Forest Access Road Construction:</b>	2.6 km and accessible from the TLH.		
<b>Non Timber Considerations And Mitigations:</b>	This area is not visible from the TLH.

<b>Description of Area:</b>	The 4LC commercial Cutting Block is located within the Mid-subarctic forest ecoregion. This is a smaller sized (42 ha) block of spruce and fir. It is not visible from the TLH, therefore should have little impact on the aesthetics of this area.	
<b>Harvesting Activity:</b>	The area has had previous sporadic harvesting and it will be harvested by commercial permit for sawlogs, energywood and fuelwood. There will be a combination of summer and winter harvesting and extraction. It is estimated that approximately 4,111 m <sup>3</sup> of softwood will be harvested out of this area between 2012 and 2016.	
<b>Silviculture Activity:</b>	Regeneration surveys will be conducted to determine level of natural regeneration 3-5 years after harvesting. A possible silviculture prescription of planting and/or gap planting of black spruce seedlings may be applied.	
<b>Primary Forest Access Road Construction:</b>	Can be access from road constructed to access 3LC

<b>Description of Area:</b>	The 5LC commercial Cutting Block is located within the Mid-subarctic forest ecoregion. This is a smaller sized (42 ha) block of spruce and fir. It is not visible from the TLH, therefore should have little impact on the aesthetics of this area.	
<b>Harvesting Activity:</b>	The area has had previous sporadic harvesting and it will be harvested by commercial permit for sawlogs, energywood and fuelwood. There will be a combination of summer and winter harvesting and extraction. It is estimated that approximately 3,912 m <sup>3</sup> of softwood will be harvested out of this area between 2012 and 2016.	
<b>Silviculture Activity:</b>	Regeneration surveys will be conducted to determine level of natural regeneration 3-5 years after harvesting. A possible silviculture prescription of planting and/or gap planting of black spruce seedlings may be applied.	
<b>Primary Forest Access Road Construction:</b>	1.3 km



<b>Description of Area:</b>		The 1LC commercial Cutting Block is located within the Mid-subarctic forest ecoregion. This is a moderately sized (72 ha) block of spruce and fir. It is marginally visible from the TLH, however should have little impact on the aesthetics of this area.	
<b>Harvesting Activity:</b>		The area has had previous sporadic harvesting and it will be harvested by commercial permit for sawlogs, energywood and fuelwood. There will be a combination of summer and winter harvesting and extraction. It is estimated that approximately 7,586 m <sup>3</sup> of softwood will be harvested out of this area between 2012 and 2016.	
<b>Silviculture Activity:</b>		Regeneration surveys will be conducted to determine level of natural regeneration 3-5 years after harvesting. A possible silviculture prescription of planting and/or gap planting of black spruce seedlings may be applied.	
<b>Primary Forest Access Road Construction:</b>		2.9 km	
<b>Non Timber Considerations And Mitigations:</b>		This area is visible from the TLH. To try and help mitigate the negative visual effect of harvesting, the Department will implement guidelines as described in detail in the forest management plan.

<b>Description of Area:</b>		The 2LC commercial Cutting Block is located within the Mid-subarctic forest ecoregion. This is a moderately sized (50 ha) block of spruce and fir. It is marginally visible from the TLH, however should have little impact on the aesthetics of this area.	
<b>Harvesting Activity:</b>		The area has had previous sporadic harvesting and it will be harvested by commercial permit for sawlogs, energywood and fuelwood. There will be a combination of summer and winter harvesting and extraction. It is estimated that approximately 5,014 m <sup>3</sup> of softwood will be harvested out of this area between 2012 and 2016.	
<b>Silviculture Activity:</b>		Regeneration surveys will be conducted to determine level of natural regeneration 3-5 years after harvesting. A possible silviculture prescription of planting and/or gap planting of black spruce seedlings may be applied.






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**Map 6**





**District 22 - 2012-2016**







