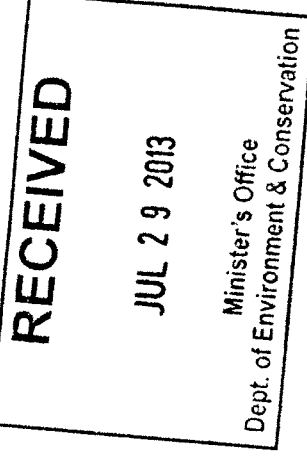

THE UNDERTAKING:

- i. The town would like to construct a new multipurpose trail that will be used for All Terrain Vehicles, snowmobiles and mountain bikes.
- ii. The trail will be located long the boundaries of Parks Canada's planning boundary (Appendix B & C) and through the enclave of Rocky Harbour (Appendix B & C) see the attached maps indicating the area for proposed development. This trail is approximately 6 kilometers in length and will provide residents a safe access route to the enclave areas of Rocky Harbour, thus alleviating the need for residents to use their All Terrain Vehicles along Route 430.

DESCRIPTION OF THE UNDERTAKING

- i. Application for the trail as been submitted to the Department of Environment and Conservation, Lands Branch. (Appendix A) The trail will be located long the boundaries of Parks Canada's planning boundary (Appendix B & C) and through the enclave of Rocky Harbour (Appendix B & C) see the attached maps indicating the area for proposed development.
- ii. The trail will be approximately 6 kilometres in length and 20' wide. The topography in the area identified for development consists of a small area of trees and shrubs and shale rock. This rock will be used to construct the trail. We will also be required to install 2-3 culverts in wet areas. The town will use a chain saw to remove the trees and shrubs from the trail which will cause noise and fumes from the chainsaw. An excavator will be hired to construct the trail. The trail development will not require any fording of brooks or streams, if so the town will obtain the required permits from the Department of Environment.

- iii. To develop a trail system which will take approximately 12 weeks
 - Week 1: Identify the area and become familiar with the scope of the terrain
 - Week 2 Trim and remove trees and shrubs from the identified area
 - Week 3 Trim and remove trees and shrubs from the identified area
 - Week 4 Trim and remove trees and shrubs from the identified area
 - Week 5 Trim and remove trees and shrubs from the identified area
 - Week 6 Trim and remove trees and shrubs from the identified area
 - Week 7 Begin excavation
 - Week 8 Excavation
 - Week 9 Excavation
 - Week 10 Spread material
 - Week 11 Spread material
 - Week 12 Complete ground work & install signage

The construction period will be approximately 12 weeks; we would like to start by mid September and wrap up by mid December.

All materials that are used at the site will be removed. No anticipated pollutants. The town will use a chainsaw and an excavator will be hire. If there are fuel leaks then the leaks will be collected, removed and disposed of as per Department of Environment regulations. There are no anticipated resource conflicts.

- iv. The trail will be used by people operating ATV/ Snowmobiles. This trail will be accessible for 12 months of the year. The only potential pollutant would be fumes from ATV's and snowmobiles. There are no anticipated resource conflicts.
- v. Town would like to employ 5 unemployed clients to obtain meaningful work experience. This project will employ one Foreman and 4 labourers. The Foreman of this project will enhance his/ her leadership and organizational skills while ensuring a safe and efficient work environment. He/ she will provide direction to the other employees. They will also learn safety skills for working in a forestry environment. The new skills that the participants will learn are lifelong skills that are transferrable into the work force. See attached classification as per National Occupational Classification 2006. (Appendix D)

The project will be reviewed periodically by the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and councilors. (Appendix E) The project will be managed by the staff of the Town of Rocky Harbour. The Town Clerk-Manager and Town Clerk Assistant have an excellent track record in managing projects of similar nature. The Public Works staff will oversee the general running of the project and the Administrative aspect will be overseen by the Town Clerk-Manager and the Town Clerk Assistant. Administration work will be completed in-kind.

Targeted participants will include women, older workers, and aboriginals.

8616 Logging and Forestry Labourers

Logging and forestry labourers perform a variety of manual tasks such as attaching choker cables to logs, planting trees, clearing brush, spraying chemicals, cleaning up landing areas and assisting other workers in woodlands operations. They are employed by logging companies and contractors.

Example titles

chokerman/woman
forestry labourer
logging labourer

swamper – logging and forestry
tree planter, seasonal

Main duties

Logging and forestry labourers perform some or all of the following duties:

- Assist other workers at logging sites
- Attach chokers or cables to felled trees for yarding
- Plant trees using manual tools
- Spray herbicides from the ground using manual spraying equipment
- Clear trails through woodlands using chain saws
- Clean up landing areas at logging sites.

Additional information

- There is mobility among jobs in this unit group.
- Progression to other positions, such as silviculture and forestry worker, chain saw and skidder operator or logging machinery operator, is possible with experience.

Employment requirements

- Completion of secondary school may be required.
- Completion of pre-employment safety courses may be required.
- Several weeks of formal and on-the-job training are provided.
- Workplace hazardous materials information system (WHMIS) certificate may be required.
- Chemicals application licence may be required.

8211 Supervisors, Logging and Forestry

Supervisors in this unit group supervise and co-ordinate the activities of workers engaged in logging operations and silvicultural operations. They are employed by logging companies, contractors and government agencies.

forest operations supervisor
forestry crew supervisor
hook tender
logging contractor

logging foreman/woman
production supervisor – logging
silviculture supervisor
woods foreman/woman

Main duties

Supervisors in this unit group perform some or all of the following duties:

- Supervise and co-ordinate the activities of logging and forestry workers in woodland operations, often in several work locations over several square kilometres
- Supervise silvicultural activities such as scarification, planting and vegetation control
- Schedule work crews, equipment and transportation for several work locations
- Resolve work problems and recommend measures to improve work methods
- Instruct workers in safety, recognize unsafe work conditions and modify work procedures
- Ensure that government regulations are met
- Communicate with forestry technical, professional and management personnel regarding forest harvesting and forest management plans, procedures and schedules
- Prepare production and other reports
- Hire and train new workers.

Employment requirements

- Completion of secondary school is usually required.
- Completion of a one- to three-year college program for forestry technologists or technicians may be required.
- Formal company training and several months of on-the-job training are provided.
- Several years of experience as a logger, silvicultural worker, or logging machinery operator are usually required.
- A chemical application licence may be required.
- An industrial first aid certificate may be required.
