The Undertaking

White Mountain Trail involves an extension to an existing trail which will include the creation of new trail. With the integration of existing trail enable access from St Bernards to Bay de lewa

The ultimate goal in the future will be join up to the Burin Peninsula Trailway. The extension will include 5 km of new trail

Trail width will be approximately 6-9 ft and will be used all year by atv; snowmobiles; and hikers. It is hoped that the type of trail system will also add tourist potential in the area

Description of the undertaking

Location - The trail will begin south of route 212 and east of power house and from there we will go south west 3 km and then we go west 2 km and join up to existing trail

Physical Features - The terrain consists of barren rolling ridges with low shrubs. Will include minimal cutting of trees. The trail will require the crossing of 1 if not 2 small brooks which will be bridged or culverts will be used to reduce impact on environment.

Construction - All construction will be performed by excavator as well as labour by members of the white mountain trail Assoc. The estimated time would take approx. 2-4 weeks and would commence upon approval of application provided weather remains satisfactory. The trail would be constructed to protect wetland

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;streams and would not interfere with wildlife .Any bridges constructed would be free of contaminates (pressure treated)

Schedule

Work would begin once all permits are in place and a suitable time can be attained by all involved

Funding

All funding will be the responsibility of the white mountain trail Assoc through membership fees and fundraising .As well a jcp project that can be awarded would also play a part in cost associated with construction

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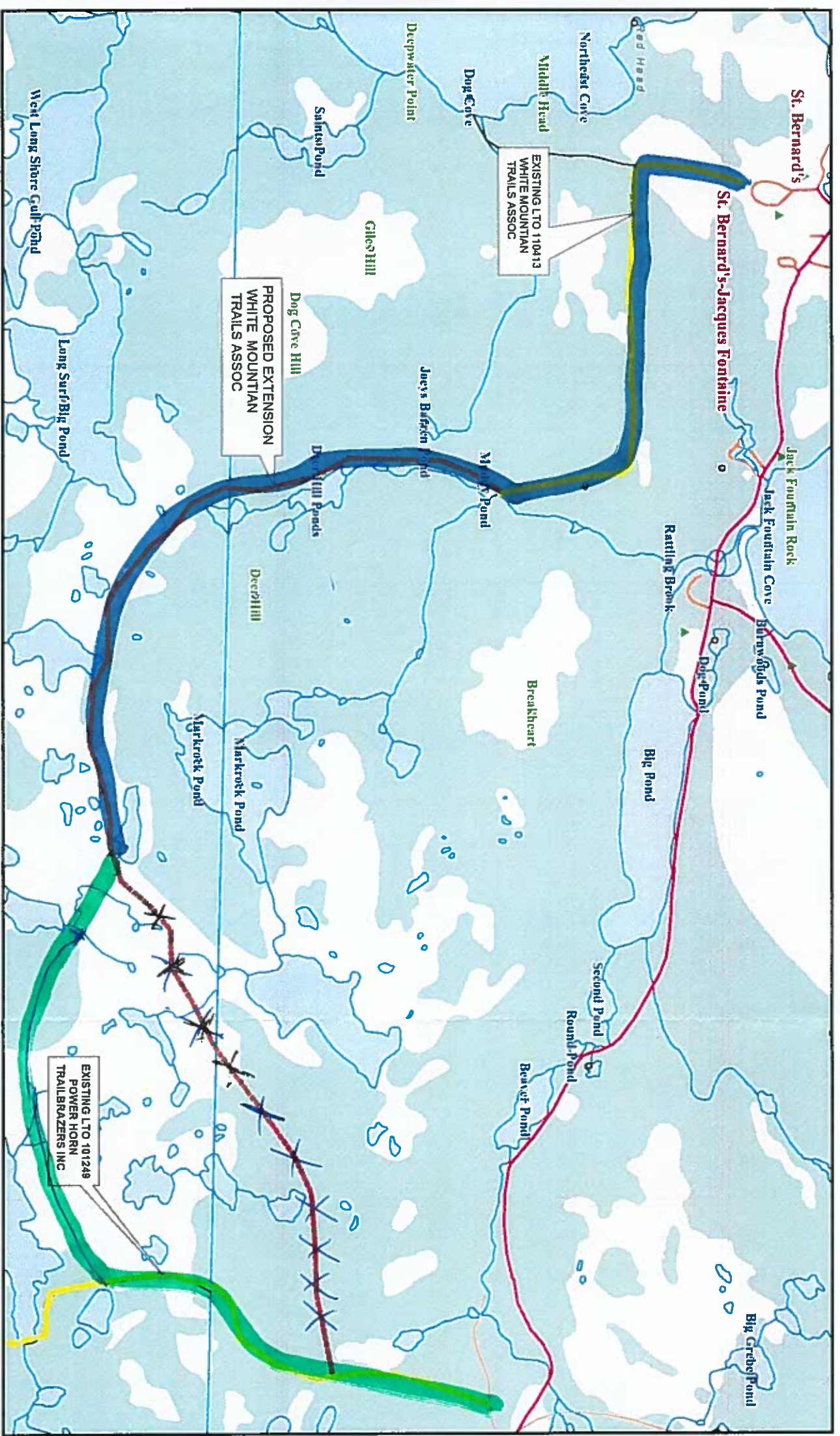
