Re: Petty Harbour Microbrewery

Your proposal has been reviewed by an interdepartmental screening committee and an opportunity to comment has been provided to the public as required by the Newfoundland and Labrador *Environmental Protection Act*, SNL 2002, cE-14.2. Upon consideration of the comments received, please be advised that this undertaking is released from further environmental assessment review.

Please be advised, the proposed site falls within the 20 year designated flood zone of Petty Harbour. A permit is required from the Water Resources Management Division for any work in a designated flood risk zone. Any effluent or runoff leaving the site will be required to conform to the requirements of the Environmental Control Water and Sewage Regulations. Contact Dr. Ali Khan, Manager, at (709)729-2295 or akhan@gov.nl.ca. All waste material. including the processed organic material (e.g. spent grain) shall be considered, prior to disposal, for reuse, resale, and/or recycling. For information on composting, contact Ms. Vicki Ficzere, Environmental Scientist. Pollution Prevention Division. at (709)729-7012 vickificzere@gov.nl.ca. Also, development, building and occupancy permits are required from the Town of Petty Harbour - Maddox Cove.

In addition to the requirements noted above, the project is still subject to other legislative requirements. A summary of the comments received from government agencies during the review is attached to provide an indication of likely applicable permits, approvals, and legislative requirements. You may also refer to the BizPaL website at www.bizpal.ca. BizPaL is an online tool that generates a list of permits, licences and authorizations that may be required when starting or expanding a business. You are also encouraged to contact Canada Business Newfoundland and Labrador (CBNL) for any additional information you may need in dealing with various levels of government. CBNL serves as a first point of access to federal and provincial government services, programs and regulatory requirements for business.
