The Undertaking:

i. Nature of the Undertaking:

The owners of Scudrunner Brewing Limited—are seeking approval to open a microbrewery in a leased stand-alone building in Gander NL. A microbrewery is defined as producing less than 15,000 hectoliters of beer per year. In comparison, large macrobreweries such as Labatt or

Molson, produce over 600 times as much, at roughly 10 million hectoliters per year.

The proposed microbrewery will produce 10 hectoliters per batch, with approximately 6 brew days per month. There will be an area with seating for customers to sit and sample the products, called a tap room or "tasting area". Retail products with the brewery logo will be sold onsite as well.

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ii. Purpose/Rationale/Need for the Undertaking:

Considering the trend in North America of Craft Beer growth, and the awareness of the importance of supporting local businesses, a microbrewery in Gander is well placed to serve to year-round demand for high quality beers, as well tap into the summer and winter tourism market.

The tourism industry is Gander is a huge focus right now, and the hype being generated by "Come From Away" and the associated tours already being booked to visit Gander will bolster our sales. Gander also benefits from summer tourism in association with Golf packages and ATV packages, and in winter with snow mobile packages

With only 6 microbreweries in the province, Newfoundland's craft beer industry has room for growth—in comparison, Nova Scotia has over 40 craft breweries, and New Brunswick has over 30. Scudrunner Brewing Limited would be an asset to the town of Gander, and surrounding area.

iii. Brewing Operations:

The ingredients used in the brewing process are all natural (water, malted barley, hops and yeast), and there will be no need for the use of preservatives in our products. The process of cracking grain will create a small amount of dust which we intend to minimize by using a closed container and by hydrating the grain as it pours into the mash tun. The amount of dust is not large enough to create a fire or explosion hazard. We intend to store and crack our grain as recommended by fire regulations.

When the grain is steeped in hot water starches are extracted and the hot liquid that is drained from the mash tun is called "wort".

The liquid will then be boiled and hops will be added. Once the boil is complete, the liquid will be chilled with a counter flow chiller (heat exchanger) and transferred to a fermentation tank. Fresh water used in the chilling process is sent to the Hot Liquor Tank after the heat exchange. Both the kettle and the fermentation tank will have a sludgy, organic substance created from the use of hops and yeast called "trub", which will be composted.

iii a. Waste

The total expected solid waste, grain and trub, from the brewing process should be no more than 250Kgs per batch or 2000kgs per month. The grain will be moved from the mash tun into special grain bags and loaded onto a trailer for immediate removal. This grain and trub will be shared amongst several local farmers who will use it either for compost or animal feed depending on their operational needs. In the event of uncollected grain waste, the town of Gander provides a compost site, and there are several bakeries in the town which have expressed interest in using the grain in their products.

Small amounts of grain and trub may be expected to enter the floor drains during the cleaning

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process.

The cleaning chemicals used in the brewery will be non-hazardous, similar to thousands of existing breweries in North America. Powdered Brewery Wash (PBW)will be used daily to clean equipment. It is a carbonate based cleaner and will be diluted and dispose of through the floor drains. Peracetic acid will be used as a disinfectant for kegs and equipment. It is an organic compound which can also be diluted and disposed of through the floor drains. This acid will first be recycled several times and used in the airlock for the fermenters.

Occasionally a strong acid cleaner may be needed to dissolve "beerstone", also known as calcium oxalate, which is a buildup of minerals and proteins that accumulates on brewery tanks as they age. This type of cleaner will be used minimally and will be saved and reused several times, once spent it will be neutralized before disposal into municipal sewage.

We will use environmentally friendly cleaning products in the tap room and bathrooms as well.

Waste water from both brewing, and cleaning should total approximately 100 litres per brewing day or about 800 litres per month.

iv. Description of the Undertaking:

The building is located within the town of Gander, at 131 Roe Ave. The entire property (building) in which the brewery will be located is 2000 square feet and is surrounded by a parking area.

The property for the Undertaking is zoned as commercial / light industrial and we have made arrangements with the Town of Gander about having a microbrewery in this location. We have been informed that there should be no issue preventing this, and are currently seeking written approval from the Town at the earliest date possible. Stamped engineered drawing are available at request.

The building currently has access to municipal water services, and we will continue to use these services for the brewery. The building currently has municipal sewage services for the bathrooms as well, and there are several floor drains. Scudrunner Brewing Limited is committed to supporting local business, as well supporting and protecting local environment, therefore we intend to use best practices to avoid any harm to the Gander ecosystems or habitats.

There will be no structural changes made to the exterior of the building for the microbrewery, only some minor renovations, mostly cosmetic, to the interior of the building.

A bar and tap system will be installed and a small seating (tasting) area will be constructed for clients to sit and socialize. It is our goal to have a seating area outside in the summer months.

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Occupations:

The brewery will be operated by both of the business owners. David Jerrett will work full time in the Brewery, while Sam Newman will work part time, and continue flying as an airline pilot. Scudrunner Brewing Limited will create a small number of jobs in its early stages, and grow to support a larger staff in the future.




