RE: Buchans Plateau ATV Trails

Your proposal has been reviewed by an interdepartmental screening committee and an opportunity to comment has been provided to the public as required by the Newfoundland and Labrador *Environmental Protection Act*, SNL 2002, cE-14.2. Please be advised that this undertaking is **released** from further environmental assessment subject to the following conditions:

- A minimum 50-metre naturally vegetated buffer must be maintained along all waterbodies and wetlands to protect sensitive wetland complexes as well as riparian and aquatic species, and their habitat; and,
- An Environmental Protection Plan (EPP) must be submitted for Trails #1 and #2 to provide more information on how these trails are to be constructed and maintained, identify the potential adverse impacts, outline mitigative measures to minimize impacts on the sensitive habitats and local wildlife in the area, and address the long-term maintenance of these trails as they are within areas identified as core caribou, rock ptarmigan and arctic hare habitat.

Although the undertaking, as proposed, is released from further environmental assessment, it is still subject to other relevant legislative requirements. In particular please note that the Crown land under consideration for your proposal for Trail #3 is not available due to concerns raised by the Wildlife Division, Department of Fisheries and Land Resources. Therefore Trail #3 as described in your registration document and in Crown land application #151164, is not permitted to proceed.

The Water Resources Management Division of this department advises that a permit is required under the *Water Resources Act*, 2002, specifically Section 48 for any work in any body of water (including wetland) including but not limited to culverts, bridges, diversion channels, etc.. The Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment supports Environment and Climate Change Canada's recommendation that in order to avoid nest destruction and to accommodate the breeding season of migratory songbirds and waterfowl, operations should consider nesting locations between April 15th and August 15th in this region. However, as some species protected under the *Migratory Birds Convention Act* (MBCA) do nest outside of this time period, it is the responsibility of the proponent to ensure that project activities are in compliance with the MCBA and associated regulations. Although the undertaking, as proposed, is released from further environmental assessment, it is still subject to other legislative requirements. A summary of the comments received from government agencies during the review is attached to provide an indication of likely applicable permits, approvals and legislative requirements. Please note that you must comply with all relevant legislation and obtain all necessary permits and approvals. You are required to inform this Department of any proposed significant changes to the undertaking.
