**Re: Bauline Line Quarry (Torbay)**

Your proposal has been reviewed by an interdepartmental screening committee and an opportunity to comment has been provided to the public as required by the Newfoundland and Labrador *Environmental Protection Act*, SNL 2002, cE-14.2. Upon consideration of the comments received, please be advised that this undertaking is released from further environmental assessment subject to the following conditions:

- The proponent must maintain a 0.65 hectare undisturbed tree/vegetated buffer in the middle of the quarry to reduce visibility from the Bauline Line, see attached map. Approval will be required from the Department of Natural Resources and Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment for any modifications to the buffer.
- The proponent must maintain a 0.12 hectare undisturbed tree/vegetated buffer in the southwest corner of the quarry for Gosse's Pond and Big Three Corner Pond Management Area for the Torbay Municipal Wetland Stewardship Agreement, see attached map.

Please be advised, a water resources management plan is required from the Water Resources Management Division. Contact Dr. Ali Khan, Manager, at (709)729-2295 or [akhan@gov.nl.ca](mailto:akhan@gov.nl.ca). A quarry permit is required from the Mines Branch, Department of Natural Resources. Contact Mr. Stephen Hinchey, at (709)729-5748 or [stephenhinchey@gov.nl.ca](mailto:stephenhinchey@gov.nl.ca). Also, development, building and occupancy permits are required from the Town of Torbay.

The Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment supports Environment and Climate Change Canada's recommendation that in order to avoid nest destruction and to accommodate the breeding season of migratory songbirds and waterfowl, operations should consider nesting locations between April 15<sup>th</sup> and August 15<sup>th</sup> in this region. However, as some species protected under the *Migratory Birds Convention Act* (MBCA) do nest outside of this time period, it is the responsibility of the proponent to ensure that project activities are in compliance with the MBCA and associated regulations. In addition to the requirements noted above, the project is still subject to other legislative requirements. A summary of the comments received from government agencies during the review is attached to provide an indication of likely applicable permits, approvals, and legislative requirements. BizPaL is an online tool that generates a list of permits, licences and authorizations that may be required when starting or expanding a business.
