RE: St. Anthony Gravel Quarry – Registration 2044

Your proposal has been reviewed by an interdepartmental environmental assessment screening committee and an opportunity to comment has been provided to the public as required by Part X of the Newfoundland and Labrador *Environmental Protection Act*, SNL 2002, cE-14.2. Please be advised that this undertaking is **released** from further environmental assessment subject to the following conditions:

- No vegetation clearing is to occur within 800 metres (m) of a bald eagle or osprey nest during the nesting season (March 15 to July 31) and 200m during the remainder of the year. The 200m buffer also applies to all other raptor nests (e.g. Northern Goshawk, Sharp-shinned Hawk, Merlin, American Kestrel, Great-horned Owl, Boreal Owl, Northern Saw-whet Owl). The location of any raptor nest site must be reported to the Department of Fisheries and Land Resources, Wildlife Division.
- A minimum 30m undisturbed vegetated buffer is required along all waterbodies and wetlands that appear on a 1:50,000 topo map to protect sensitive riparian and aquatic species, and their habitat. For further information on buffers, please contact the Department of Fisheries and Land Resources, Wildlife Division, at (709) 637-2025.
- In addition, the St. Anthony Development Regulations state that a mineral working must be located a minimum of 50m from a waterbody or watercourse. For further information on the St. Anthony Development Regulations, please contact the Department of Municipal Affairs and Environment, Local Governance and Land Use Planning Division at (709) 729-1953.

The Water Resources Management Division of my department requires that you obtain a permit for any work in any body of water (including wetland) including but not limited to culverts, bridges, diversion channels, etc. You must also apply for and obtain a permit should any infilling within fifteen (15) metres of a body of water be required. For

further information, please contact the Water Resources Management Division at 709-729-2295.

The Local Governance and Land Use Planning Division of my department advises that a development permit from the Town of St. Anthony is required prior to commencing the undertaking. For further information, please contact the Town at (709) 454-3454, 454-3453 or 454-2812.

The Department of Natural Resources advises that progressive rehabilitation of the quarry is a standard condition of a quarry permit. The Quarry Rights Section will monitor your compliance with this condition. In addition, there are additional quarries near your proposal. Should a boundary dispute arise, you must agree to accept the decision of the Department of Natural Resources in resolving the dispute.

The Forestry Division of the Department of Fisheries and Land Resources advises that you are required to obtain a Commercial Harvesting Permit prior to any harvesting or timber removal in the area. An Operating Permit is required prior to the start of any work during the forest fire season and a permit to burn must be obtained to ignite a fire on or within 300 meters of forest land. Environment and Climate Change Canada recommends that in order to avoid nest destruction and to accommodate the breeding season of migratory songbirds and waterfowl, operations should consider nesting locations between April 15th and August 15th in this region. However, as some species protected under the *Migratory Birds Convention Act (MBCA)* do nest outside of this time period, it is the responsibility of the proponent to ensure that project activities are in compliance with the *MCBA* and associated regulations. The Department of Fisheries and Oceans advises that you are required to self-assess using the DFO "Projects Near Water" website located at <http://www.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/pnw-ppe/index-eng.html>. For further information, please contact the Fisheries Protection Program at (709) 772-4140.

Although the undertaking, as proposed, is released from further environmental assessment, it is still subject to other legislative requirements. A summary of the comments received from government agencies during the review is attached to provide an indication of likely applicable permits, approvals and legislative requirements. Please note that you must comply with all relevant legislation and obtain all necessary permits and approvals. You are required to inform this Department of any proposed significant changes to the undertaking.
