Green Bay Logging Limited's registration document, submitted to the Environmental Assessment Division, indicates that the following products as potential sources of solid waste materials from our sawmill operations. The current markets of all such products are also identified.

**Note:** Regular on-site garbage is brought to the Green Bay Waste Management site on a weekly basis. All recyclables will be brought to the Green Depot in Springdale.

Currently, there is a shortage of all the products listed above. During operations, Green Bay Logging transports 1-2 trailer loads of chips and sawdust to Corner Brook Pulp and Paper (CBPP) per week. CBPP have indicated that they will accept whatever sawdust and wood chips the mill can produce. Green Bay Logging is strategically located in central Newfoundland and only 200 meters off the T.C.H. Corner Brook Pulp and Paper is currently transporting wood chips from Bloomfield, Bonavista Bay, an additional 330 kilometers away.

## **Contingency Plan**

If for some reason we lose CBPP as a market for chips and sawdust, we would investigate the availability of other clients who would be using or converting to biofuels in the province. It is anticipated that the local demand by farmers for chips and sawdust will continue.

If the mill cannot market all its sawdust and wood chips, any surplus waste products will the transported at the Green Bay Waste Management Site, located approximately nine kilometers away, near the town of South Brook.

With the continuous instability of the home heating fuel prices, it is anticipated that there will always be a large market for slabs and the spoilage from the core box production.

Green Bay Logging Limited commits to notifying the Department if there is any significant change to the operations as outlined in the Environmental Assessment document.
