Regulatory Advice from Government Departments

EA 2279 – Cooper Cove Marine Terminal Expansion (the Project)

During the environmental assessment of the Project, provincial and federal government departments and agencies indicated that the following plans, permits, licences, approvals and/or other authorizations are or may be required before your Project commences. This is not intended to be a comprehensive list and you are responsible for consulting with federal and provincial government authorities regarding any additional authorizations that may be required by law.

The Climate Change Branch (CCB) of the Department of Environment and Climate Change (ECC) advises you to consider provincial climate change projections for Argentia in the planning for this undertaking as it is anticipated that extreme precipitation events will become more intense. All heavy-duty equipment used in the construction phase of the Project should be operated in a manner to maximize fuel efficiency, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions that could contribute to climate change. The Pollution Prevention Division (PPD) of ECC advises that if pesticide use is planned, a Pesticide Applicator License will be required, or if pest control services are contracted, the business must have a valid Pesticide Operator's Licence. Spill response equipment should be readily available, and a Spill Contingency Plan specific to the proposed undertaking should be developed. Any spill or leak of gasoline or associated product is to be reported immediately by calling the Environmental Emergencies Telephone Line at 1-800-563-9089. The Water Resources Management Division (WRMD) of ECC advises that you must apply for and obtain a permit for any work in or within fifteen (15) metres of a body of water and a Water Use License for the use of any water for any purpose, prior to start of work. Any effluent or runoff leaving the site must conform to the requirements of the Environmental Control Water and Sewage Regulations, 2003. The Office of Women and Gender Equality (WGE) recommend that you to develop a Women's Employment Plan (WEP) for the construction phase of the Project. The WEP should identify specific commitments to support the recruitment, training, employment and retention of women and gender diverse persons. All fuel storage tank systems connected to a heating appliance of a capacity of 2,500 litres or less must comply with the Heating Oil Storage Tank System Regulations. The storage, handling, and disposal of used and or waste oil must be compliant with the Used Oil and Used Glycol Control Regulations.
