During the environmental assessment of the Project, provincial and federal government departments and agencies indicated that the following plans, permits, licences, approvals and/or other authorizations are or may be required before your Project commences. This is not intended to be a comprehensive list and you are responsible for consulting with federal and provincial government authorities regarding any additional authorizations that may be required by law.

The Climate Change Branch (CCB) of the Department of Environment and Climate Change advises that heavy duty equipment used in this Project should be operated in a manner to maximize fuel efficiency, thereby reducing greenhouse gas emissions that could contribute to climate change. The Pollution Prevention Division (PPD) of the Department of Environment and Climate Change advises you to consider developing a contingency plan specific to the proposed undertaking to enable a quick and effective response to a spill event. Any spill or leak of gasoline or associated product shall be reported immediately by calling the Environmental Emergencies Telephone Line at 1-800-563-9089. If the use of a pesticide(s) is required a Pesticide Applicator Licence will be required. For further information, please contact the PPD at (709) 729-5782.

The Water Resources Management Division (WRMD) of the Department of Environment and Climate Change advises that you must apply for and obtain a water use licence for the use of water from any water source for any purpose. If a well is required, you must apply for and obtain a permit for Constructing a Non-Domestic Well and follow the necessary groundwater monitoring requirements prior to the start of construction. Any effluent or runoff leaving the site will be required to conform to the requirements of the Environmental Control Water and Sewage Regulations. The Government Service Centre (GSC) of the Department of Digital Government and Service NL (DGSNL) advises that any increase in animal units, will require an amended to your Certificate of Approval for a waste management system. Any work within 400 metres of Route 430 will require a development permit. For further information, please contact the GSC at (709) 637-2204.

The Department of Fisheries, Forestry and Agriculture (FFA) advises the Project area is currently under an active Crown land application, and activities are not permitted until a Crown lease is issued under Section 3 of the **Lands Act**. For further information, please contact FFA at (709) 637-2950.

The Department of Industry, Energy and Technology (IET) advises that any quarry materials required for the Project must be obtained from approved sources. For further information, please contact IET at (709) 729-3131.

Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) recommends that you develop the following plans:

- A Management Plan that includes appropriate preventative measures to minimize the risk of impacts on migratory birds;
- An Oil Spill Prevention and Response Plan;
- A site specific Contingency Plan that considers potential accidents and malfunctions; and
- A gull management plan focused upon exclusion of gulls from feed, carcasses and other wastes.

ECCC further advises that in order to avoid nest destruction and to accommodate the breeding season of migratory birds, operations should consider nesting locations between April 15 and August 15 in this region. ECCC requests that species-at-risk sightings be reported to the Canadian Wildlife Service (CWS) at ec.scfatldonneesei-cwsatliadata.ec@ec.gc.ca and to the Atlantic Canada Conservation Data Centre at <http://accdc.com/en/contribute.html>.
