4.0 DESCRIPTION OF THE UNDERTAKING:

- -I am requesting your permission to complete the topping of the breakwater that is already in place at 1 Sweetapple Cove, Glovertown NL AOG 2L0
- -The preferred choice of location and design is as per #162480 Maps Attached.
- -There will be no negative impact on these natural flowing events. The water as always, follows the path of least resistance. The breakwater will not interfere with any of these events when and if they should occur.
- -The breakwater will have no negative impact on not only the fish patters, but also no impact on any angler movements in the area.

(i) Operation:

-The armour stone will be trucked to the site and put in place by an excavator, no equipment will be working in water.

(i) Geographical Location:

-As per google map the geographical location is as shown, Maps attached.

(ii) Physical Features:

- -The size of the area is Approximately 7M x 45M/47M as shown on the conceptual drawings attached. Also attached is a letter addressing the concerns of the council of the Town of Glovertown, no negative impact on any of their concerns
- This has Already approved by council just waiting for approval of Permit from your department. The waterbody that the project will occur in the mouth of Angle Brook in the water of Alexander Bay the species, habitat or resource/use-concerns/conflicts that may occur in this area is explained in the letter sent to **Management** on November 27th, 2023, Dept of Environmental and Climate Change, Copy attached.
- -There are no potential human or recreational receptors that will be impacted by the project In regards to Angle Brook, this is not a popular fishing area. The mouth of the Terra Nova River is approximately 200M from where the breakwater is located is the popular fishing area.

(iii) Construction (if applicable):

- -The material that was used at that time was rock that was collected around the local area of Angle brook at very low tide. No material was trucked in at that particular time.
- -The only material that will be trucked in is to complete the topping of the breakwater. The purpose of the construction is to protect my boat when launching and docking my boat.
- No Construction is required only placing armour stone from a local stone quarry to place the top layer of the breakwater.

FISH/FISH HABIT AND WATER

- --There will be no negative impact on any small shoreline wildlife or waterfowl species that could be in the surrounding area on the shoreline or in, or on, the adjacent water. Any historical movements of any species of waterfowl or small shoreline dwelling animals that may be in the surrounding area will have no negative impact on their day to day lives as the result of the breakwater.
- -There is no through traffic into, or out of Alexander Bay on the water. During low tide any passage through the Bay is not possible due to the lack of Water. During high tide, any access would be very challenging because of the limited water depth required to support even the smallest watercraft. The breakwater would have no impact on the natural water levels that would dictate any travel through this area.
- -There will be no disruption in any of the surrounding shoreline. It will remain at the same level of access as the current conditions dictate. The Breakwater will have no negative impact on this.

Occupations:

- No employees are required, as I will be completing this work myself. If approved, the
 construction to complete the breakwater will take two to three days at most. I am
 hoping to complete this project by the first or second week of June 2024

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

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
