The Federal/Provincial Management Committee is pleased to provide your Town with the Canada - Newfoundland and Labrador Municipal Rural Infrastructure Fund (MRIF) Application Package.

In order to streamline the application process and assist the Management Committee with the evaluation of the submissions, an online application format has been developed. This Application Package will also serve as the application for the Provincial Municipal Capital Works Program (MCWP). Projects which are not eligible for or have not been successful in obtaining funding from MRIF may be considered for funding under MCWP.

The Town should only apply for projects which are affordable as demonstrated by the completion of the Financial Evaluation forms included with this Application Package. Preparation of the Financial Evaluation for water and/or sewer projects should be based on a cost share ratio of [share] on the Provincial/Municipal portion of the MRIF funding, which will be two thirds of the project cost. All other projects funded under MRIF will be cost shared equally between the three levels of government.

Applications will be accepted at any time up to September 30, 2009, however, the deadline for the receipt of applications to be considered in Round 1 of funding allocations is April 3, 2006. Applications received after this date and those which were not successful in Round 1 will be advanced to Round 2 for consideration. Any applications that were on file from previous funding programs are no longer active.

- Resolution of the Local Government authorizing the Application, 3 copies
- Project Cost Estimates, 7 copies
